

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, Congress and the General Assembly of the State of Colorado have designated May 15th as National Peace Officers'

Memorial Day, and the week of May 10th through 16th as National Law

Enforcement Memorial Week; and

WHEREAS, during Law Enforcement Memorial Week, and in particular on Peace Officers'

Memorial Day, we honor those officers who made the ultimate sacrifice while

performing their sworn duty; and

WHEREAS, since 1776, there have been 24,203 law enforcement officers in the United

States that have been killed in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, 146 law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty in the

United States. Three officers were killed in the line of duty in Colorado: Corporal Daniel H. Groves, Colorado State Patrol; Master Trooper William James Modén, Colorado State Patrol; and Sergeant Joshua Eli Voth of the

Colorado Department of Corrections; and

WHEREAS, the City of Northglenn tragically lost one of their own officers, Corporal Edgar

"E.B." Rains Jr., who was killed in the line of duty 36 years ago on May 30th,

1984; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate for all residents to join together in commemorating

police officers, past and present, who by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities have rendered a dedicated service to their community,

helping to preserve the rights and security of all residents.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Meredith Leighty, Mayor of the City of Northglenn, Colorado, do hereby proclaim May 10th through 16th, 2020 as **National Law Enforcement**

Memorial Week in the City of Northglenn.

I FURTHER proclaim May 15th, 2020 as National Peace Officers' Memorial

Day in the City of Northglenn in honor of those law enforcement officers who, through their courageous deeds, have made the ultimate sacrifice in service to their community.
