RECOMMENDATION: Attached to this memorandum is a Resolution, which, if approved, would allow the installation of the 2012 People's Choice winning sculpture Bee My Honey by Colette Pitcher at the west fork of the Grange Hall Creek trail near Washington Street. Also attached to this memorandum is a picture of the sculpture as well as a letter from the Northglenn Arts and Humanities Foundation (NAHF) Board of Trustees that shows support for this recommendation.


BACKGROUND: Bee My Honey was first chosen by a citizen's committee as one of the six sculptures to be a part of the 2012/13 Art on Parade. Visitors to E.B. Rains Jr. Memorial Park voted for Bee My Honey as the People's Choice winner of the six Art on Parade sculptures.


Historically, the NAHF have committed to purchasing the People's Choice winner and gifting the sculpture to the City of Northglenn as an addition to its growing sculpture collection. The NAHF is pleased to purchase Bee My Honey and gift it to the City of Northglenn.

The NAHF recommends installation of *Bee My Honey* by Colette Pitcher at the fork of the Grange Hall Creek trail, just to the west of Washington Street. This site is conducive to sculpture placement because of the pedestrian traffic exposure and will give this area of the City a sculpture presence. The sculpture will be installed directly to a ground-level cement pad. The cement pad will be installed by the City and paid for by the NAHF.

BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS: If this location is approved, plans will be put into place for the installation after Grange Hall Creek construction is complete. The dedication will likely occur in the spring of 2014. All installation costs, including the cement and plague, will be paid by the NAHF.

Dear Amanda:

On behalf of the Northglenn Arts & Humanities Foundation (NAHF), I would like to request that the following location be presented to City Council for the permanent installation of the sculpture, *Bee My Honey* by Colette Pitcher. We anticipate the installation in winter of 2013 and dedication in early spring of 2014 after Grange Hall Creek construction is complete.

Proposed location: West Fork of Grange Hall Creek Trail

The NAHF is requesting placement of *Bee My Honey* at the west fork of the Grange Hall Creek trail near Washington Street. It would be placed on the west side of the street, near the fork in the trail, at ground level. The NAHF believes this location site is conducive to sculpture placement because of high pedestrian traffic exposure. This location will add sculpture to an area or town with no sculpture presence and will provide trail specific viewing. *Bee My Honey* is a large bronze depiction of a bear reaching for a bee hive in a tree. The sculpture will be installed directly to a cement pad to complement the local natural aesthetic. We feel that *Bee My Honey* is perfect for the site.

Site preparation: A cement foundation will be laid to secure the sculpture. NAHF will pay for the installation of the pad and all necessary costs to secure the sculpture to the pad.
