- Governor's Safer At Home executive order runs through July 30
- Mandatory statewide face coverings order through August 16th for 11 years and older for indoor public spaces
- Tri-County Health Department mandatory face coverings order for 90 days starting on July 24th for indoor and outdoor spaces
- State and local public health orders ARE MANDATORY

SAFER AT HOME

Non-critical businesses that are open:

- Maximum 50% employees
- 6-foot social distancing
- 10 or fewer people in a single location
- Required to have:
 - Measures to keep employees and customers/clients at least 6 feet apart
 - Measures to prevent unnecessary contact
 - Measures to increase sanitization
 - Measures to prevent crowds from gathering



SAFER AT HOME

- Retail and Personal Services <u>can open if implementing</u> <u>best practices.</u>
- Offices can open at 50% reduced capacity, <u>if best</u> practices are being implemented.
- Businesses <u>should still use telecommuting to the</u> <u>greatest extent possible</u>.



EVERYONE NEEDS TO DO

- Requirement to wear a face covering in public
- 6-foot social distancing
- No gatherings greater than 10 people in a single location with social distancing
- At-risk/vulnerable populations need to take extra precautions
- Stay at Home
