SUBJECT: Northglenn V.A.L.E. Grant Acceptance

RECOMMENDATION:

Attached to this memorandum is a Resolution which, if approved, would accept a grant in the amount of \$4,840 from the Northglenn Municipal Victim Assistance and Law Enforcement (V.A.L.E.) Board. Staff recommends approval of the proposed Resolution.

BACKGROUND:

The use of computers in the commission of crime continues to rise. Therefore, computers seized by the Northglenn Police Department require careful examination for evidence of criminal activity. In the past, the Northglenn Police Department sent computers to the Colorado Bureau of Investigations (CBI) or the Rocky Mountain Information Network (RMIN) for examination. On average, it took a year or more for them to examine and process the evidence on each computer.

Due to the long turn around time, the Northglenn Police Department requested that Criminal Information Systems Coordinator, Todd Fields, conduct the forensic examinations on seized computers. Mr. Fields completed several free classes offered by the National White Collar Crime Center and received additional training on Computer Forensic Software (ILOOK and FTK). Mr. Fields has conducted 6 computer forensic examinations for the Northglenn Police Department with a 2-4 week turn around time providing the necessary information for a timely investigation.

The grant funds will provide Mr. Fields the opportunity to attend the Certified Computer Examiner Boot Camp and test for Certified Computer Examiner Certification at the completion of the course.

BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:

There are no budget implications to attend this training course as the grant will fund the entire cost.

SECTION A -PROBLEM SOLVING APPROACH

Please briefly describe the problem-solving approach employed for this proposed project. Include problem identification, problem analysis, action plan/response, and evaluation/assessment of the response, along with the anticipated results.

The Northglenn Police Department currently investigates cases where evidence is contained on computers. In the past, the Northglenn Police Department sent the computers to CBI or the Rocky Mountain Information Network for examination. On average, it would take more than a year to get evidence back on a case.

The Northglenn Police Department requested that I start conducting forensic examinations on computers collected on cases they were working. In order to gain the knowledge to do the examinations, I attended one basic and advance level class through the National White Collar Crime Center on FAT file systems. Presently, I am able to return the evidence in about two weeks but my current software and training limits the amount of evidence I am able to recover.

I have helped with six cases, usually two computers per case, over the last year and half. In addition, I was recently contacted by Crested Butte Police Department to perform a forensic examination on three computers. The demand for computer forensic exams is becoming a need in our technological times.

Presently, I use two different software applications when conducting an examination, ILOOK and FTK and have received some training on both applications. However, I am currently lacking training on the FTK software, NTFS file system and the Microsoft Vista operating system. I am applying for a grant so I can attend a course that will cover these areas in detail. With additional training I would be able to recover more evidence on computers that require more skills than our current software can provide.

I will also receive the following software at the class:

- SMART software -Forensic Examination Tool similar to FTK and ILOOK.
- Simple Carver Data recovery software
- Passware Kit- Password recovery software

This class will increase my knowledge and add several software packages to my toolkit for conducting computer forensic examinations. At the completion of the class, I will take a test to obtain a certification as a Certified Computer Examiner through The International Society of Forensic Computer Examiners.

The recovery of data or evidence that I will be trained on will not only help me serve the police department but will directly help victims. Specifically, it will speed up the recovery time of evidence and ensure that criminal cases are brought before courts more expeditiously. Having cases prosecuted sooner will directly benefit victims because accompanied testimony will be fresh and it may prevent others from becoming victims by

putting suspects in jail instead of allowing them to re-victimize others while waiting for trail.

Thank you for taking the time in considering this request. I look forward to visiting with you at the upcoming VALE boarding meeting.
