CR-113, Liquor Licensing Fee Increase

RECOMMENDATION:

Attached to this memorandum is a resolution which, if approved, would increase the fees charged by the City for certain liquor license applications to the maximum limits allowed by the State. Staff recommends approval of the proposed resolution.

BACKGROUND:

Senate Bill 07-149, which was signed into law on April 20, 2007, raised the maximum fees that local licensing authorities may charge for the following license applications: new license applications, transfer of ownership applications, renewal applications and special event permit applications. The fees charged by the City cannot exceed the limits established by the State and must be set to cover actual and necessary expenses incurred in the processing of the applications.

The Bill allowed for a phased-in increase as shown in the table below. City Council approved the first phase of the fee increase by adopting Resolution 07-67 on July 26, 2007. If approved, CR-115 would raise the current fees to the maximum allowed in the second phase, and the new fees would be effective through July 1, 2009.

Staff prepared an analysis of actual costs for processing liquor license applications at the request of the Liquor Licensing Authority (Authority) in June of 2007. The cost analysis measured the activities and staff time involved in processing the license applications, and the cost analysis has since been updated for the Authority's review. The proposed fee increase will be presented to the Authority at their regular meeting on Monday, July 21, 2008, and staff will communicate the Authority's recommendation regarding the second phase of fee increases to Council prior to the July 24, 2008 Council meeting.

BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS:

The fee increase would result in additional revenue estimated to be less than \$2,500.00 annually.
