Council to order on Thursday, May 8, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, 11701 Community Center Drive,

PLEDGE AND INVOCATION

The Pledge of Allegiance was given followed by the Invocation,

which was delivered by Police Chaplain Bret Truax.

about an incident that occurred on February 22, 2008 at Legacy High School in which Mr. Steve Hanson, Northglenn Aquatics Director, and Mr. John Scott, Aurora Fire Battalion Chief and Northglenn resident, provided assistance to a woman in medical distress. Chief O'Hayre stated that their immediate actions contributed to saving the life of the woman, Ms. Melissa Malcolm-Peck. Chief O'Hayre presented Mr. Hanson and Mr. Scott with the Life-Saving Award and

thanked the men for their willingness to help.

Ms. Malcolm-Peck came forward and thanked Mr. Hanson and Mr.

Scott for their assistance in saving her life.

Ms. Hewitt spoke about day care programs, medical services and senior housing, and distributed information to Council about the organization.

Mr. John Irons, TLC Chief Financial Officer, provided information about the organization's non-profit status.

Ms. Kathy Dilger, TLC Thornton Center Director, provided information about the number of people served at the Thornton

facility, the number of employees and the services provided by the organization.

The City Council meeting recessed at 8:20 p.m.

RECONVENE

The City Council meeting reconvened at 8:29 p.m.

Action Item: Selection of Financial Management System Vendor

Council member Wieneke spoke about the need to select a financial management system and the pricing proposals that have been submitted by Innoprise and Springbrook Software. Council member Wieneke spoke about the companies' maintenance agreements and stated that he would like to evaluate the proposals and consider the item at the May 22, 2008 meeting.

COMMUNICATIONS

COUNCIL

Council member Wieneke reported on the meeting that was held with Safeway on May 1, 2008, and provided information about what caused the store to leave the Malley Shopping Center. Council member Wieneke reported that it was a good conversation and noted that they parted on good terms. Council member Wieneke also spoke about the agenda format for communications and suggested replacing the specific representative reports with a placeholder for general communications.

Council member Clyne reported that Ms. Sonia DiCarlo, Planning Commission Chairwoman, had given birth to a boy, Evan, on May 1st. Council member Clyne also reported that an organizational meeting would be held for the House Tour project on Wednesday, May 14, 2008 at 5:00 p.m. at the Stonehocker Farmhouse and invited anyone interested to attend.

Council member Downing reported that a free concert would be held on Saturday, May 17, 2008 at the Stonehocker Farmhouse. She stated that the concert and open house events have been made possible by a grant that the Historic Preservation Commission received from the Colorado Historic Society. Council member Downing reported that the second annual Community Garden would be planted on Saturday, May 17th and encouraged participation in the gardening project. Council member Downing also reported on the volunteer luncheon she attended at the Senior Center and noted that it was a nice event.

Mayor Novak reported that she had attended the North Metro Children's Advocacy Center dinner on Saturday night and spoke about the services the organization provides to young victims. Mayor Novak spoke about the DRCOG Metro Vision Issues Committee study session that was held regarding the FasTracks annual report, and reported that the Committee had forwarded a recommendation to the Board of Directors.

Council member Paiz reported that she had recently served as a judge for the Project Citizens program at Northglenn High School and provided information about the program. Council member Paiz reported that she and Council members Baker and Wieneke attended the barbeque at the Fire District's training facility, but were unable to take a tour of the facility due to inclement weather. Council member Paiz also reported that she had attended the Metro Chambers roundtable meeting and the Day of Prayer breakfast.

Council member Monroe spoke about an inquiry she received regarding the use of tents on private property for a Boy Scout function, and asked staff to provide her with information regarding the request. Council member Monroe also reported that the Youth Commission is busy preparing for their presentation to Council on May 22nd regarding financing for the skate park.

Council member Baker spoke about Mr. Bill Gillespie's involvement with the Senior Breakfast events, and spoke about the need for someone to step in for Mr. Gillespie.

City Manager Krieger spoke about scheduling the follow-up meeting with Mr. Lyle Sumek and asked Council to let him know which date they would prefer to meet.

Mayor Novak stated that the Candlelight Vigil would be held at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, May 15th, and stated that she would like Council to be able to attend the event. There was discussion about the study session items and it was the consensus of Council to convene the study session at 5:30 p.m. to allow everyone an opportunity to attend the vigil.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

2008 Budget Reduction Process

Council member Baker stated that he believes a formal cost reduction program should be implemented.

Council member Wieneke spoke about reducing expenditures in the budget and provided information about revenue received in prior years. Council member Wieneke suggested that rather than making considerable cuts in 2009, a review of the 2008 budget be conducted

> to determine expenditures that could be eliminated this year. Council member Wieneke spoke about developing a methodology for evaluating projects and the need to economize. He stated that he would like to have a discussion with the City Manager regarding finding reductions in the expenditures.

> There was discussion about the work done at the Council retreat to identify core required services and the process of setting priorities for the City. It was the consensus of Council to address the budget reduction process at the follow-up meeting with the retreat facilitator.

Historic Preservation **Foundation Funding**

Council member Downing stated that \$35,000 had been budgeted for the Historic Preservation Foundation to maintain the Stonehocker Farmhouse and property, and requested that the funding be released to allow the organization to complete necessary projects.

MOTION TO PASS

Council member Downing MOVED and it was SECONDED by Council member Monroe to release funding in the amount of \$35,000 to the Northglenn Historic Foundation.

MOTION WITHDRAWN There was discussion and the motion was WITHDRAWN.

There was discussion about the agreement that has been drafted between the Foundation and the City, and the issues that need to be worked out between the two entities. There was also discussion about the maintenance of the property and the Foundation's projects.

Council member Paiz requested that the Foundation meet with Council to address the issues relating to the agreement so that the funding can be released to the organization.

Council directed staff to release \$10,000 immediately to the Northglenn Historic Foundation and to invite the Foundation to attend a future study session to discuss the agreement.

Naming of a Facility for Bill Gillespie

Council member Downing spoke about the possibility of naming the Senior Center in recognition of Bill Gillespie. There was discussion about naming a park for Mr. Gillespie and the parks naming policy that has been established by Council. It was the consensus of Council to refer the item to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board for suggestions.

PUBLIC INVITED TO BE HEARD

Mayor Novak invited any member of the public wishing to speak on any subject to come forward.

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y,	Mr. Dallas Briggs, Ward I, spoke about the Stonehocker Park. Mr. Briggs spoke about the expense of historic properties and stated that he feels a meeting should be held with Council, staff and the Northglenn Historic Foundation to finalize a plan.
