SUBJECT: CR- 124 – Placement of the sculpture *Double Spinner* by Lyman Whitaker in the roundabout at Melody Drive and Kennedy Drive.

RECOMMENDATION: Attached to this memorandum is a Resolution, which, if approved, would allow the installation of the 2009 People's Choice winning sculpture *Double Spinner* by Lyman Whitaker in the roundabout at Melody Drive and Kennedy Drive. Also attached to this memorandum is a picture of the sculpture as well as a letter from the Northglenn Arts and Humanities Foundation (NAHF) Board of Trustees that shows support for this recommendation.

BACKGROUND: *Double Spinner* was first chosen by a citizen's committee as one of the six sculptures to be a part of the 2009/10 Art on Parade. Visitors to E.B. Rains Jr. Memorial Park overwhelmingly voted for *Double Spinner* as the People's Choice winner of the six Art on Parade sculptures.

Historically, the NAHF have committed to purchasing the People's Choice winner and gifting the sculpture to the City of Northglenn as an addition to its growing sculpture collection. The NAHF is pleased to purchase *Double Spinner* and gift it to the City of Northglenn.

The NAHF recommends installation of *Double Spinner* in the center of the roundabout at Melody Drive and Kennedy Drive. This site is conducive to sculpture placement because of the high traffic exposure. *Double Spinner* is a kinetic wind sculpture that is better seen from a distance rather than a more traditional bronze sculpture that you touch and experience in close proximity. The sculpture will be installed directly into the ground using a cement foundation to support the one and half inch diameter post and will stand approximately 12 feet high to be seen from all sides. The Public Works Department and the Police Department were both consulted about the placement of the sculpture in the roundabout and both departments had no objections with the planned location.

BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS: If this location is approved, plans will immediately be put into place for pouring a concrete foundation that will support the post that the sculpture sits on. All installation costs, including the cement foundation, will be paid by the NAHF.

Dear Brian:

On behalf of the Northglenn Arts & Humanities Foundation (NAHF), I would like to request that the following location be presented to City Council for the permanent installation of the sculpture, *Double Spinner* by Lyman Whitaker. We anticipate the installation to take place in September, with a likely public dedication October 2010.

Proposed location: The roundabout at Melody Drive and Kennedy Drive (Ward 4)

The NAHF is requesting placement of *Double Spinner* in the center of the roundabout at the intersection of Melody Drive and Kennedy Drive. The NAHF believes this location site is conducive to sculpture placement because of the high traffic exposure of the Market Place. *Double Spinner* is a tall kinetic wind sculpture that spins as the wind blows through it and would be ideal in this location. The sculpture will be installed in the center of the roundabout balancing out the stone and organic design. This location will be the first time that the NAHF will be able to add to the vibrant entryways into the Marketplace. Because the sculpture is best seen from a distance, there will be no issue with the fact that a pedestrian cannot touch the piece. Additionally this will help protect the sculpture.

Site preparation: A cement foundation will be laid underground to secure the inch and half steal post the sculpture sits on.

Following approval by the Northglenn City Council, I will need to present the proposed location to the Adams County Cultural Council (SCFD Commission) for approval, as well.


