**SUBJECT: Water & Wastewater Rates Increases CB-1717**

**BACKGROUND:**

The City of Northglenn provides water and wastewater services to approximately 10,250 customer accounts. The services are primarily funded via water and wastewater charges collected from utility customers. To ensure that future water and wastewater charges would meet the future costs of providing such services (e.g. water rights, operations, maintenance, capital etc.), the City contracted with Red Oak Consulting to develop a water and wastewater rate study.

The study determined that in order to meet the funding and service requirements of the water and wastewater functions, overall revenue collections would need to increase approximately 7.5% to 8% annually in each of the subsequent five years. Based on the information presented in the study, the City increased its water rates effective July 2009 which was soon followed by an increase in wastewater rates in September.

**UPDATE:**

In accordance with the rate study recommendations, staff has attached an ordinance for consideration by the Council, which would increase the water and wastewater rates effective June 28, 2010. The rates used were gathered directly from the rate study provided by Red Oak Consulting and are anticipated to increase water and wastewater revenue collections by \$591,706 or 7.85% assuming usage remains fairly constant when compared to the prior year (based on 2009 water and wastewater user charge collections of approximately \$7.54 million).

The attached ordinance would repeal and reenact the new water and wastewater rates in sections 16-10-4(c) and 16-10-5(f) of the municipal code respectively. Please note the current code includes wastewater rates in both sections, however in an effort to avoid confusion the wastewater rates will now only appear in section 16-10-5(f) titled, "SEWER INCREMENTAL RATE TABLE".

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REENACTING SECTION 16-10-4, SUBSECTION (c) AND SECTION 16-10-5, SUBSECTION (f) OF THE NORTHGLENN MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING WATER AND WASTEWATER RATE CHANGES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. Section 16-10-4, subsection (c) of the Northglenn Municipal Code is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

(c) FRESH-WATER INCREMENTAL USAGE/RATE TABLE.

Section 2. Section 16-10-5, subsection (f) of the Northglenn Municipal Code is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

(f) SEWER USAGE INCREMENTAL RATE TABLE

Note #1. For all "non-residential" wastewater having a 5 day biochemical oxygen demand (BOD5) greater than 200 parts per million (ppm), the "metered coefficient" may be proportionally raised, with coefficients assigned to recover the incremental cost of treatment of the higher concentration of BOD5.

Note #2. For all "non-residential" wastewater having a total suspended solids concentration (TSS) greater than 190 parts per million (ppm), the "metered coefficient"

may be proportionally raised, with coefficients assigned to recover the incremental cost of treatment of the higher concentration of TSS.

Section 3. The rate changes set forth above shall be effective as of June 28, 2010, at the first full billing cycle.
