Economic Development Update

Ms. Debbie Tuttle, Economic Development Manager, spoke about infrastructure improvements at 120th Avenue and Grant Street and the inaugural Northglenn Business Appreciation Breakfast scheduled for November 8, 2012 at Boondocks Fun Center. Ms. Tuttle spoke about business closures, new businesses, and business expansion projects. Ms. Tuttle also updated City Council on the status of the Urban Renewal Plan.

Mayor Pro Tem Clyne reported she had attended the Metro Area Initiative on Homelessness and asked City Manager Simmons to provide information to Council regarding how the City addresses the issue. Mayor Pro Tem Clyne spoke about the Regional Leadership Forum on Diverse Middle Class Communities scheduled for October 18, 2012 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Mapleton Conference Center. Mayor Pro Tem Clyne reported she has received calls regarding traffic issues on 118th Avenue and suggested holding a neighborhood meeting on the issue.

Police Commander Beth Carmosino provided information about traffic enforcement in the area of 118th Avenue.

Council member Brown reported on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board meeting. Council member Brown stated the Board discussed the 2013 proposed budget and will be reviewing vendor and fee waiver guidelines at a future meeting.

Council member W. Dodge reported on a recent fundraiser for Access Housing and announced that the Relay For Life at Webster Lake had raised \$158,500 for cancer research. Council member W. Dodge stated that advertising has been placed on three trash trucks and reported that a community meeting regarding issues at the Skatepark is scheduled for October 16, 2012.

City Manager Simmons provided information about the Communications Manager position and reviewed items for the October 15, 2012 study session.

City Attorney Hoffmann reported he would be bringing draft ordinances regarding camping and safety issues in E.B. Rains, Jr. Memorial Park to an upcoming study session for Council's review.
