### BACKGROUND

Since the completion of the Webster Lake Rehabilitation project in 1999, significant erosion of the exposed shoreline has been observed. Over 500 square feet of shoreline has been lost primarily due to wave action caused by the prevailing winds. The Webster Lake Rehabilitation project included a combination of derrick stone (boulders) and wetland materials around the perimeter of Webster Lake. The majority of the wetland plants were unable to establish leaving those areas prone to continued erosion. Since then nearly all of exposed areas have been replaced with boulders and/or some other form of hardscape. Of the remaining exposed areas, the west shoreline between the calming cove and the boat house is the most impacted by the wave action.

In order to stabilize the shoreline and prevent further erosion, a repair project for the west shoreline was originally advertised for bid in 2008. At that time, the project included installing hardscape material along the west shoreline of Webster Lake between the boathouse and the calming cove. After receiving the bids, it was proposed to City Council that the remaining exposed shoreline (excluding the calming cove) be included in the scope of work, due to the particularly low unit prices for the original project and for the prevention of future erosion. As an alternative, City Council (with input from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board) directed staff to develop a design utilizing wetland plants in lieu of hardscape material, and to focus only on the western shoreline. As a result, staff began working on a design in 2009 that was limited to stabilizing the shoreline on the west side of Webster Lake. Prior to the completion of the design, the Parks and Reaction Advisory Board recommended that staff include an additional area south of the boathouse in the project scope.

### **BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS**

The cost of Webster Lake Shoreline Stabilization project as proposed is \$50,395.87 plus a 10% contingency of \$5,039.59 for a total of \$55,435.46. This bid falls within the engineer's estimate for this project. Project funding of \$55,435.46 is indentified in the 2010 Capital Improvement Projects Fund.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the proposed Resolution. Attached to this memorandum is a Resolution that, if approved, would:

1) Authorize the Mayor to execute a contract between the City of Northglenn and Kemp & Hoffman, Inc. for the 2010 Webster Lake Shoreline Stabilization in the amount of \$50,395.87;

2) Authorize \$5,039.59 as a contingency and authorize the City Manager, on behalf of the City, to approve minor changes in the scope of work and execute relevant change orders up to the approved expenditure limit of \$55,435.46.

6. The CITY will pay to the CONTRACTOR in the manner and at such times as set forth in the General Conditions such amounts as required by the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

7. This AGREEMENT shall be binding upon all parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns.
