SUBJECT: July, 2010 Economic Development Update

Existing Businesses

Staff is continuing to coordinate an incentive for additional signage at the Marketplace with the property owner (LaSalle) and the NURA board. The owner is finalizing the operational policy for the sign and all parties are hoping to reach an agreement at the July 14 or July 28 NURA meeting.

The Applebee's restaurant on 104th and I-25 has submitted plans for a façade improvement. The restaurant chain is changing the exterior of their stores nationwide in a re-branding effort. The approval will be granted administratively and maintains consistency with the Planned Unit Development originally approved for the site.

Webster Lake

Staff is continuing to receive phone calls from the sign placed on the Webster Lake redevelopment site. For serious inquiries, staff is scheduling meetings and providing a brief history of the site to prospective brokers and/or developers. The meetings are mutually beneficial since staff is learning more about specific retailers in the market and the pros and cons of our development site. Staff intends to summarize the information for all contacts and provide it to City Council and NURA in a future executive session(s).

New Businesses


