SUBJECT: CR-139 Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Grant Acceptance

#### RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends adoption of the attached Resolution accepting a FY 2010 Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Program Grant in the amount of \$5,134.00.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Earlier this year the City entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Colorado Springs for the purpose of joining the Internet Crimes Against Children ("ICAC") Regional Task Force. Joining the ICAC Task Force allows the Northglenn Police Department to investigate internet crimes against children in a proactive manner. The grant request applied for was for up to a total of 107 hours of overtime and other approved expenses between September 2010 and April 2011.

The grant provides for two detectives to work overtime hours proactively seeking out internet luring cases to locate those involved in the enticement of children, obscenity directed to minors, child prostitution, and the manufacturing, distribution, or possession of child pornography. These types of investigations (many using undercover scenarios) are necessary to arrest, prosecute and convict individuals committing these types of crime.

This grant was written and submitted upon approval of the IGA. The Northglenn Police Department received written notification of our selection to receive \$5,134.00 in funding under FY 2010 Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Program.

### **BUDGET IMPLICATIONS:**

There is no financial cost to the City. Any cost related to overtime, training or travel will be reimbursed by this grant up to \$5,134.00.

It is my pleasure to inform you that the Northglenn Police Department has been selected to receive \$5,134 in funding under the FY 10 Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Program grant (approximately 1.6% of the total supplemental award given to Colorado). This grant is administered by the City of Colorado Springs on a reimbursement basis. The federal award number is 2009-MC-CX-K011.

The City of Colorado Springs is currently in the process of approving and appropriating the federal grant award.
