A RESOLUTION AFFIRMING THE INTENT OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN TO BUDGET AND APPROPRIATE ONE HUNDRED EIGHT THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$108,367) IN THE YEAR 2008 TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE 120TH AVENUE EXTENSION PROJECT BETWEEN QUEBEC STREET AND U.S. HIGHWAY 85.

WHEREAS, the City has promised to contribute one hundred eight thousand three hundred sixty-seven dollars (\$108,367) to the County of Adams for work currently being done by the County on 120th Avenue between Quebec Street and U.S. Highway 85; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to affirm its intent to budget and appropriate the aforementioned funds for the 2008 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. It is the intent of the City Council of the City of Northglenn to fulfill its promise to contribute one hundred eight thousand three hundred sixty seven dollars (\$108,367) to the County of Adams for work currently being done by the County on 120th Avenue between Quebec Street and U.S. Highway 85, and the City Council hereby affirms its intent to budget and appropriate this sum for the budget year of 2008.

Dear Commissioner Strickland:

Since receiving your letter of September 13, 1999, the City of Northglenn has continued to review the County's proposal to share funding of the 20% local match required for the extension of 120th Avenue from Quebec Street to US-85 with other entities along the corridor. We understand that the project funding distribution as detailed in your letter would require that the City of Northglenn contribute a total sum of \$88,367.00 over three years beginning in the 2001 fiscal year. Lengthy discussions among council members and with City staff, coupled with a recent presentation of the proposed 120th Avenue project by County staff on the evening of February 10, 2000 has helped answer many questions of previous concern to us.

We remain concerned, however, that the extension of 120th Avenue to US-85 will exacerbate the current problems of congestion from the interchange of I-25 & 120th Avenue to Huron Street. Your support, as well as those of our neighboring cities, is necessary to insure timely resolution of the existing congestion issues prior to the completion of the proposed 120th Avenue extension. Northglenn is also exploring the design and construction of an overpass at 112th Avenue which we believe will relieve congestion on both 104th and 120th Avenues and enhance response time for critical emergency services. We anticipate that only a county wide endorsement for this project will accelerate the approval of the project beyond the planning and engineering design phases.

The City of Northglenn has historically been financially supportive of the regional benefits of 120th Avenue and demonstrated that support through the investment of hundreds of thousands of City dollars. Major City capital construction projects for the widening, overlay, and maintenance of this corridor from I-25 to York Street have been appropriated in our annual operating budget for more than a decade.

Although the City of Northglenn currently does not contemplate any direct economic development advantage or recovery from the completion of 120th Avenue from Quebec to US-85 that may be enjoyed by the other Adams County cities along the corridor, we will continue to support the regional effort with a commitment to support the County funding formula as currently proposed. This financial support is, of course, subject to the commitment of the other named cities and Adams County to their respective shares as detailed in your original letter of September 13, 1999.

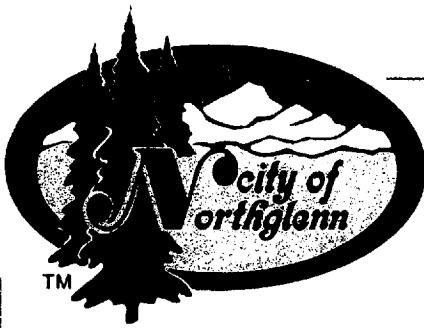

Dear Ms. Cullen:

The long-awaited completion of the 120th Avenue extension, between Quebec Street and U.S. Hwy. 85 is at hand. A ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrating the opening of the road is scheduled for Aug. 17, 2006. Invitations will be mailed soon.

You will recall that federal funding for this project was received through DRCOG in two phases. Phase one was for a two-lane cross section and phase two funded the increment necessary to build a four-lane cross section. In big numbers, broken down by funding source, the following is the most current estimate of the costs of the project:

Federal Funds	\$19.3 million
County Funds	\$16.5 million
Municipal Funds	\$1.5 million
Total	\$37.3 million

This cost estimate includes environmental, design, right-of-way acquisition, noise mitigation, construction management and construction.

For each phase of the project, the City of Northglenn made a provisional commitment to participate in the project. We decided not to ask for the city's participation until such time as the project was a reality and the total scope of the project was known. At this time, we are asking each participating city to contemplate a budget provision for their 2007, and possibly 2008 budget, to honor their commitment to this project.

The City of Northglenn indicated the participation for each phase as follows:

Phase I	\$88,367
Phase II	\$20,000
Total	\$108,367



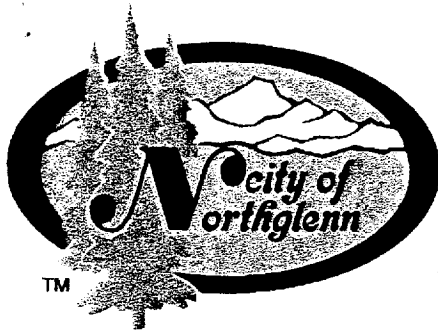


We received your May 30, 2006 letter, regarding Northglenn's contribution to the 120th Avenue extension between Quebec Street and U.S. Hwy 85.
