## **DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

Northglenn Justice Center Update

Mr. Steve Grace, Operations Manager, provided an update on the Northglenn Justice Center project and reviewed information regarding the project design budget, project schedule, and procurement of a construction contractor. Mr. Grace stated the public open house is scheduled for August 18<sup>th</sup> and provided additional information about the architect's cost analysis for the project.

Mr. Grace addressed questions from Council regarding the selection of an independent third-party estimator, cost estimate information provided in the bid process, and having the City perform an assessment of the cost estimates.

Mr. David Willett, Director of Public Works, provided information about practices related to reviewing cost estimates, guaranteed maximum price contracts, and subcontractors.

City Attorney Hoffmann suggested the third-party estimator, as a subcontractor, provide an affirmative statement identifying the information is an independent, third-party estimate.

There was discussion and it was the consensus of Council to request an affirmative statement regarding the third-party cost estimate for the project.

There was discussion regarding attendance at the mandatory pre-bid meeting, the timeline for procuring a construction contractor, including financing costs in the total project budget, current construction costs, and staff's intent to initiate another round of cost cutting if the independent estimate shows a significantly higher cost for the project.

### **COMMUNICATIONS:**

Council

Council member Whitman reported on North Metro Fire Rescue District Battalion Chief Bruce Ginther's retirement and reported the Rangeview Library District will be utilizing the former library building on Huron Street for internal administration and technology offices. Council member Whitman reported she attended the Mayor

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on the Move Youth Edition and stated she is looking forward to participating in National Night Out next Tuesday.

Council member B. Brown thanked residents for maintaining their yards.

Mayor Pro Tem Dodge reported on the success of the Northglenn Senior Organization's (NSO) Bake Sale at the Fourth of July Festival and noted the NSO sold the grand prize winning ticket for the Duck Derby. Mayor Pro Tem Dodge reported she attended The Addams Family musical at the DL Parsons Theatre and the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner.

Mayor Downing reported she attended The Addams Family production and a ribbon cutting event for Quest Diagnostics, which is a new business in the Webster Lake Promenade. Mayor Downing thanked the Youth Commission for their involvement in the Mayor on the Move Youth Edition and stated it was a great event.

Council member Mullica thanked Council member Snetzinger for bringing forward CR-84 – Support of Northglenn Police Department and Law Enforcement Officers Nationwide. Council member Mullica stated his son Logan will be turning one on August 1<sup>st</sup> and wished him a happy birthday.

City Clerk Small reported the City Clerk's office, along with staff from Parks, Recreation & Cultural Services, Planning & Development, and Special Events, will be staffing the City's exhibitor booth at the Adams County Fair August 3-7 and encouraged Council to stop by the booth.

City Manager Hayes reported he distributed a 90-day report to City Council and stated staff has been working on the proposed 2017 budget and a City-wide work plan.

City Attorney Hoffmann reported he will be serving on the Colorado Municipal League's taskforce to address legislature affecting municipal courts and will provide updates to City Council.
