SUBJECT: CR-64 – Support for Adams County Open Space Grant Request for Blender Bikes

PURPOSE

Staff is seeking approval of the attached resolution supporting an Adams County Open Space mini grant application requesting grant funds in an amount up to \$5,000; not to exceed 50% of the total project costs for the purchase of two "blender bikes" and the associated supplies.

BACKGROUND

There are two opportunities each year to seek grant funding from Adams County Open Space (ACOS). Funding for these grants comes from the ACOS Tax, of which 68% is distributed through a competitive grant process. Adams County Resolution 99-1 and the ACOS Policies and Procedures manual outline eligible uses for these funds.

The funding is divided into two categories – active and passive. A request for a passive project may be for up to 70% of the total budget, a request for an active project may be for up to 60% of the project. Mini grants may be submitted in an amount not to exceed \$5,000; there are no funding request limits on the other grant types. In the past, the board has shown a preference to projects that don't exceed a 50% request, however, more recently the board has been more receptive of requests up to the maximum allowable amount. Based on the anticipated project cost, this proposal is intended to be submitted as a mini-grant in the active use category for an amount not to exceed 50% of the total project cost.

Funds are already identified in the amount of \$5,000 in the Planning and Development operating budget for the Healthy Eating, Active Living (HEAL) program for the purchase of materials and program implementation. Funding would be used to purchase two blender bikes, a tool designed to be used at community events to engage attendees and encourage an active, healthy lifestyle. Similar bikes have been borrowed from the University of Colorado for several events during the past two years, and were always met with enthusiasm from the public. By serving as a very visible, fun, and interactive activity at events, these bikes will help draw visitors in to the HEAL booth to make a healthy smoothie and learn about other ways that HEAL is supporting the health and wellness of people in the community.

Approval of the resolution will serve as support for the grant application. A copy of the resolution will be included with the final application.

Adams County Open Space grant applications are due by July 22, 2019. The proposed resolution, along with the full grant proposal, needs to be submitted to Adams County by that date.

Grants will be reviewed by the Adams County Open Space Advisory Board in August 2019, and staff will participate in presentations and respond to questions from the Board in September. Funding decisions are generally made in October or November.
