**SUBJECT:** CR-123 – Amendment to the Standley Lake Park Intergovernmental Agreement

#### PURPOSE

City Council is considering CR-123, a resolution to approve an amendment to the Standley Lake Park Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Northglenn, City of Thornton and City of Westminster.

#### BACKGROUND

In 1992, the City of Westminster annexed Standley Lake into Westminster. At that time, the lake was being considered for development into a State park. In 1994, Standley Lake was officially designated as a State park. Prior to that time, the water in the lake was used solely as a drinking water supply for the cities of Northglenn, Thornton, and Westminster, as well as an agricultural supply for Farmers Reservoir and Irrigation Company shareholders. In order to protect the lake's water quality from potential pollutant sources attributable to recreational uses, the three cities entered into the Standley Lake Park IGA. The IGA identifies the types of allowable recreational uses, requires best management practices for shoreline development, and identifies consequences should lake quality be adversely impacted by recreational use. Protection of the water rights is identified as the top priority of the IGA and will remain the top priority in future renewals.

Staff began discussions regarding updates to the 1994 Agreement well in advance of its 2019 termination date. During this time, it was found that multiple season boat permit holders were in violation of the Zebra/Quagga Mussel quarantine protocols. The City of Westminster removed boats from the lake until a solution that is protective of water quality could be found. Trailered boating is the outstanding issue that needs to be resolved prior to finalizing a long-term IGA.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Attached to this memorandum is CR-123, a resolution that, if approved, would authorize the Mayor to execute an amendment to the Standley Lake Park IGA. Staff recommends approval of CR-123.

## AMENDMENT TO THE STANDLEY LAKE PARK INTERGOVEMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF WESTMINSTER, THE CITY OF THORNTON, AND THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN DATED November 28<sup>th</sup>, 1994

  - d. The term of this Agreement is for <u>a</u> twenty-five years <u>initial term</u>. <u>After the initial</u> term, this Agreement is hereby extended for one year. Following the one year extension, this Agreement and may be renewed, by agreement of the Cities, for a successive twenty-five year period.

- 3. All other terms and conditions of this Agreement shall remain in effect.
