

## **PROCLAMATION**

whereas, in 1961, Congress designated the third full week in March to be National Poison Prevention Week, and since then this week has helped to raise national awareness of the dangers of potentially poisonous household items such as prescription medicines, cleaning products, pesticides, and other substances: and

**WHEREAS**, 87 people die every day from unintentional poisoning and each year, the nation's poison control centers answer more than 2.6 million calls; and

**WHEREAS**, 93% of poisonings occur in people's homes and 45% of poison exposures involve children under the age of 6; and

WHEREAS, most poisoning incidents revolve around highly toxic household items such as cleaning products and medicine and it is important to take preventative measures to make sure children are safe; and

**WHEREAS**, it is also important to protect our pets from ingesting poison and learn the poisoning symptoms that indicate they require attention; and

WHEREAS, medical science is constantly learning more about poisons and National Poison Prevention Week is the perfect time to brush up not only on the standard facts, but to identify any new information that has been discovered to better guard against poisonings.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I,** Meredith Leighty, Mayor of the City of Northglenn, Colorado, do hereby proclaim March 14<sup>th</sup> through 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021 as
