A RESOLUTION DETERMINING NOT TO REMOVE BOB MCCOY FROM THE NORTHGLENN URBAN RENEWAL AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, Bob McCoy ("Commissioner McCoy") is currently a duly appointed commissioner of the Northglenn Urban Renewal Authority ("NURA");

WHEREAS, by Memorandum dated April 13, 2011, to the Mayor of the City of Northglenn, NURA requested that Commissioner McCoy be removed from NURA for inefficiency and misconduct in office;

WHEREAS, upon receipt of the above referenced correspondence from NURA, the Mayor determined pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-25-104(4) to bring charges seeking removal of Commissioner McCoy as a NURA commissioner, and a quasi-judicial hearing was set in accordance with C.R.S. § 31-25-104(4) to provide Commissioner McCoy with an opportunity to be heard regarding the charges against him;

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-25-104(4), the Mayor with the consent of the governing body is authorized to remove a member of NURA "for inefficiency or neglect of duty or misconduct in office," but only after the governing body provides the commissioner whose removal is sought an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, having held a quasi-judicial hearing pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-25-104(4) and in accordance with Article 7, Chapter 3 of the Northglenn Municipal Code, the City Council adopts this Resolution regarding the removal of Commissioner McCoy.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. The City Council finds that based on the evidence presented at the quasi-judicial hearing that Commissioner McCoy's conduct does not constitute grounds for removal for inefficiency and misconduct in office pursuant to C.R.S. § 31-25-104(4).
