A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 06-92 REGARDING THE MAINTENANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN STREET SYSTEM AT A RATING OF SEVENTY (70) OR BETTER ON THE PAVEMENT CONDITION INDEX RATING SCALE

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously indicated in Resolution No. 06-92 that for every dollar spent on preventive maintenance, between \$4 and \$14 are saved in rehabilitation;

WHEREAS, the City Council previously directed that the City of Northglenn street system in its entirety be maintained at an average rating of seventy (70) or better on the Pavement Condition Index Rating Scale; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to clarify that the City's residential streets be measured and reported separately from arterial streets, and that both residential and arterial streets be required to separately maintain an average rating of seventy (70) or better on the Pavement Condition Index Rating Scale or a comparable rating of "good" using a comparable pavement condition rating system.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. In addition to the directive contained in Resolution No. 06-92 requiring that the City of Northglenn street system in its entirety be maintained at an average rating of seventy (70) or better on the Pavement Condition Index Rating Scale in accordance with the then current version of ASTM Standard No. D 6433 using the PAVER system or a comparable pavement condition rating system, the City Council further directs that both residential and arterial streets be required to separately maintain an average rating of seventy (70) or better on the Pavement Condition Index Rating Scale or a rating of "good" using a comparable pavement condition rating system.

<u>Section 2</u>. In order to maintain the pavement rating set forth above, the City Council directs that the City budget and appropriate to spend four dollars (\$4.00) per lane mile on street maintenance, said budgeting and appropriation being subject to revision in the event of a fiscal or City emergency warranting that the funds be directed to said emergency.
