country through their resilience and strong commitment to family, faith, hard

work, and service; and

WHEREAS, this year's theme, "Esperanza: A Celebration of Hispanic Heritage and

Hope," encourages us to reflect on the legacy of Hispanic people who have influenced our nation's history and serve today as leaders in all aspects of life from the Supreme Court and halls of Congress to the State Capitol, in City Hall and the community as public officials, educators, engineers, artists, soldiers, health care professionals, entrepreneurs, and essential

workers; and

WHEREAS, we recognize the important presence of the Hispanic community and

celebrate those who have inspired others to dream, study, work, serve, and

succeed; and

WHEREAS, the City of Northglenn is proud to join communities across the United States

in honoring Hispanic Americans whose leadership and achievements have significantly contributed to the success of their local communities and the

progress of America.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Meredith Leighty, Mayor of the City of Northglenn, Colorado, hereby proclaim the month of September 15th through October 15th as:
