

**CITY OF NORTHGLENN  
CITY COUNCIL MINUTES  
January 25, 2007**

**CALL TO ORDER**

Council member Paiz called a regular meeting of the Northglenn City Council to order on Thursday, January 25, 2007 at 7:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, 11701 Community Center Drive, Northglenn.

**ROLL CALL**

Present were: Council members Clyne, Garner, Monroe, Paiz, Miller, Parsons, Martin.

**PLEDGE AND  
INVOCATION**

The Pledge of Allegiance was given followed by the Invocation, which was delivered by Council member Parsons.

**AGENDA ADDITIONS  
AND DELETIONS**

There were no additions or deletions to the agenda.

**PUBLIC INVITED  
TO BE HEARD**

Council member Paiz called for any person wishing to address City Council on any subject not set for public hearing to come forward.

Mr. Dallas Briggs, Ward I, spoke about CR-06 and asked Council to consider extending the waiver for building plan and check fees to all property owners. Mr. Briggs stated that he feels a select group of people would benefit from CR-06 and spoke about conflicts of interest with the resolution.

Mr. Terry Wadding, Ward IV, urged Council to adopt the building codes tonight.

Ms. Madeline Lehman, 721 W. 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue, spoke about living in Northglenn and stated that she does not want to lose the library here. Ms. Lehman stated that she feels Winburn Park would be a good location for the library and asked City Council to do what they could to keep a library in the City.

Dr. Sean Reif, Ward I, expressed concern about the absence of pedestrian access near the MotoSpa construction area and the new Glenn Bar and Grille restaurant on Irma Drive. Dr. Reif also spoke about Wyco Park and the expansion work being done on Wyco Elementary School. He stated the park had been used for a rugby league last year and expressed concern about the loss of the use of the area for recreational purposes.

Mr. Tommy Follett thanked Council for sponsoring the resolution to appoint him to the Election Commission tonight and stated he is looking forward to working with the City Clerk's office in this capacity.

Mr. Kirby Brinson, 761 W. 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue, spoke about the building codes and the regulations on the size and appearance of storage sheds. Mr. Brinson inquired about changes to the codes and how the regulations affect residents on fixed incomes.

Mr. Darrell Case, 10712 Loren Lane, asked Council to publish the snow removal plan and spoke about snow on the roadways.

**PRESENTATIONS:**  
Long Term Employee  
Awards

Mayor Novak joined Ms. Paula Jensen, Human Resources Manager, to present awards to employees with five or more years of service. Those recognized were: MaryAnn Dornfeld, Maintenance and Operations, five years; Collette Cook, Code Enforcement, five years; and Elly Percy, Finance and Internal Support Solutions, five years.

APWA Awards

City Manager Krieger stated that two staff members had recently been recognized by the American Public Works Association, Colorado Chapter. City Manager Krieger presented an award for Building Code Administration and Enforcement to Mr. Rick Davis, Chief Building Official, and also presented an award for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvement Project to Ms. Amy Ward, Civil Engineer II.

FasTracks

Mr. Dave Shelley, Regional Transportation District (RTD), stated that he is the North Metro Corridor Project Manager and introduced Mr. Joe Racosky, who is the Project Manager for URS Corporation for the FasTracks project.

Mr. Racosky provided an overview of the North Metro Corridor and stated the rail line is scheduled to open in 2015. He spoke about the draft environmental impact study (EIS) and the public meetings that have been held for the project. Mr. Racosky spoke about the purpose and needs statement for the project, the goals and objectives, and the current alternatives being considered for the North Metro Corridor. Mr. Racosky provided information about the concerns and areas of interest that have been expressed from members of the community and presented the timeline for the EIS decision-making process.

There were questions from Council about resources for the project, the possibility of the representatives attending neighborhood meetings in Northglenn, and the ability to view the draft EIS document.

Mr. Racosky stated that additional information could be found on the

project's website at [www.rtdnorthmetro.com](http://www.rtdnorthmetro.com), and stated that they have a wide range of outreach to the community that would include attending neighborhood meetings.

Mr. Shelley stated that the draft EIS document could not legally be released until it has been approved by the Federal Transit Administration for release to the public in early 2008, and spoke about the topics that are addressed and evaluated in the study.

There were questions from Council about the possible location of a station at 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue and York Street, opportunities for the public to see the diesel multiple unit (DMU) and electric multiple unit (EMU) technologies, and the study's impact on the timing of the project.

Mr. Shelley provided information about the issues surrounding the station location at 112<sup>th</sup> Avenue and York Street. He spoke about the process for evaluating all locations equally and stated that Northglenn's taskforce recommendation would be considered in the process. He reported that a video is posted on their website of a DMU vehicle and stated that they are working to get a vehicle on display for the public. Mr. Shelley stated that the study would not impact the completion of the full project. He also spoke about funding for North Metro Corridor and the information that has been gained from the other corridor projects.

Council member Paiz stated she would like to be included in the government group meetings with RTD and noted that she has invited representatives from RTD to attend the Ward I meeting scheduled for February 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. at the Northglenn Christian Church.

#### Code Enforcement Update

Police Chief Russ Van Houten presented an update on Code Enforcement for the fourth quarter of 2006. Chief Van Houten spoke about Code Enforcement staffing levels and provided information on the Clean Sweep program. He stated that 5% of the notices issued resulted in a citation and presented statistics for the notices by ward. Chief Van Houten spoke about the top five code violations for each ward and reported that there has been a 59% increase in violations issued in 2006 as compared to 2005. He addressed animal control violations and also spoke about Code Enforcement's involvement with snow removal activity.

There were questions from Council about following up on cases to ensure that the violations have been corrected, individual code enforcement calls, water restriction waivers, and snow removal in commercial zones.

Ms. Jennifer Wing, Code Compliance Supervisor, provided information about the continuation of the Clean Sweep program and

the process for following up on citations issued. Ms. Wing stated that Code Enforcement would continue to respond to individual code calls during the Clean Sweep program and also provided information about the procedures for snow removal.

It was the consensus of Council to have the Code Enforcement Officers issue citations for all code violations as opposed to issuing citations for only the top five violations in the Clean Sweep program.
