SUBJECT: CR-120 – Acceptance of 2021 Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant

PURPOSE

To consider CR-120, a resolution accepting the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) Bulletproof Vest Partnership (BVP) Grant for \$10,692 for bulletproof vests.

BACKGROUND

The Patrick Leahy Bulletproof Vest Partnership, created by the Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Act of 1998, is a unique DOJ initiative designed to provide a critical resource to state and local law enforcement. Since 1999, the BVP program has awarded more than 13,000 jurisdictions a total of \$522 million in Federal funds for the purchase of 1,441,013 vests as of November 2020.

On Oct. 18, 2021, the Police Department was awarded \$10,692, which may be used for up to 50% in reimbursement of purchase costs for bulletproof vests ordered between Oct. 18, 2021, and Aug. 31, 2023, or until all available funds have been requested.

Prior to receiving funding for reimbursement, the Police Department must meet three BVP requirements, all of which are already part of the department's policies and procedures:

- 1. Mandatory wear policy
- 2. Meet the National Institute of Justice body armor compliant product list on the date product is ordered
- 3. Uniquely fitted vest requirement, which means:
 - Protective (ballistic or stab-resistant) armor
 - Conform to the individual wearer to provide the best possible fit and coverage through a combination of:
 - Correctly sized panels and carrier determined through appropriate measurement
 - Properly adjusted straps, harnesses, fasteners, flaps, or other adjustable features

BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS

The cost of an officer's uniquely fitted vest is \$891. The typical lifespan of a vest is approximately five years if undamaged. The number of vests purchased annually fluctuates due to attrition and vest lifespan. The grant funding reimburses the half the cost of the vest or \$445.50. Based on the grant award, the Police Department can seek reimbursement for up to 24 vests.

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The Police Department plans on purchasing at least nine vests in 2022 based on the normal replacement schedule. An additional 10 vests are allocated for new officers based on 10 vacancies that the department is working to fill. Reimbursement for 19 vests total \$8,464.50.

The remaining grant allocation will be available for 5 additional vests, reimbursed at \$2,227.50 if needed due to attrition or vests that are damaged outside of the normal replacement schedule.

The bulletproof vests are funded as part of the officer uniform and equipment purchases in the Police Department's annual budget.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of CR-120.

Awards will not be extended past that date, and any unused funds will be forfeited.
