Subject: 2007 Grit and Biosolids Removal, Hauling, and Disposal

Strategic Council Goals: No. 1 – Upgraded City Infrastructure and Facilities

No. 2 – Fiscally Responsible Government

Recommended Action:

That the City Council, by Motion, authorize the Mayor to execute the attached contract between the City of Northglenn and Liquid Waste Management of Brighton, Colorado, for an amount of \$285,000 plus a 10% contingency of \$28,500, and authorize the City Manager to approve minor changes in the scope of work and execute relevant change orders up to the approved expenditure limit of \$313,500.

Background and Other Information:

Grit Removal

- Grit, which consists inorganic compound such as sand, coffee grounds and egg shells, normally settles out in the first two cells of the aerated lagoon treatment system.
- Grit should be removed on a regular basis to maintain the effectiveness of the treatment process; however, based on discussions with current staff and a review of existing records, there is no evidence of past efforts to remove grit from the WWTF.
- In 2006, the City experienced a significant increase in the number of odor complaints associated with the operations of the WWTF. Accumulated grit was identified as one of the contributing factors. Other contributing factors include long detention times between Lift Station A and the WWTF and scheduling of the 2006 biosolids removal during the summer months.
- This contract will allow the City to remove up to 2,600 wet tons of grit from the WWTF during February or March 2007.
- Of the \$285,000 contract total, \$135,000 will be applied toward grit removal activities.

Biosolids (Sludge) Removal.

- The recently completed mechanical mechanical expansion of the WWTF will generate approximately 600 dry tons of biosolids per year. These biosolids are pumped to one of the lagoon basins so they can stabilize prior to removal.
- Pursuant to the City's WWTF discharge permit issued by the State, the City is prohibited from permanently storing biosolids on-site. In addition to the work that will be performed under this contract, the City still needs to remove the biosolids that remain in an adjoining, out of service lagoon basin.
- Removed biosolids from the WWTF are usually land applied for beneficial use as fertilizer and soil conditioner in accordance with State and Federal regulations.
- This contract would allow the City to remove approximately 750 dry tons of biosolids during the spring or fall of 2007.
- Of the \$285,000 contract total, \$150,000 will be used for biosolids removal.

Policy Considerations:

> Grit removal, along with periodic flushing of the force main and construction of a new headworks facility, should reduce the frequency of future odor complaints from the surrounding community.

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- ➤ Informational letters will be sent out to the surrounding property owners prior to commencing any work since both activities (grit and biosolids removal) will result in a temporary increase in odors.
- > These activities support the Council's Goals of Upgraded City Infrastructure and Facilities and Fiscally Responsible Government.

Budget Information:

> Sufficient funds are available in the 2007 Wastewater Operations Budget (Operating Program 65104) to cover this operating expense.

- 3. The CONTRACTOR will provide performance and payment bonds and a certificate of insurance naming the City as an additional insured for purposes of said project within 10 days after the date of the NOTICE OF AWARD.
- 4. The CONTRACTOR agrees to perform all of the WORK described in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and comply with the terms therein for the sum of NOT TO EXCEED \$285,000, or as shown in the BID schedule. The CONTRACTOR will commence the work within 30 calendar days after the date of NOTICE TO PROCEED. The CONTRACTOR will complete the work within 90 calendar days after the date of NOTICE TO PROCEED unless the period for completion is extended otherwise by the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.
- 5. The term "CONTRACT DOCUMENTS" means and includes all items as set forth in Section 1.01 of the General Conditions.
- 6. The CITY will pay to the CONTRACTOR in the manner and at such times as set forth in the General Conditions such amounts as required by the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.
- 7. This AGREEMENT shall be binding upon all parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns.
