SUBJECT: CR-5 - Standley Lake Pipeline Joint Operating Committee Escrow Account Contribution

## PURPOSE

To consider CR-5, a resolution authorizing the transfer of funds to the Standley Lake Pipeline Joint Operating Committee (SLPJOC) escrow account for maintenance programming of the pipeline.

## BACKGROUND

The Standley Lake Pipeline conveys raw water from Standley Lake to the City of Northglenn and the City of Thornton. It is jointly operated by the cities of Northglenn and Thornton through the SLPJOC. The requested contribution, if approved, would allocate funding for the annual Capital Improvement Project (CIP) program. The SLPJOC Agreement states that all costs to maintain the pipeline shall be shared equally between the cities.

The annual CIP program consists primarily of maintenance projects that include the following: design/engineering services, ordering/installing pipeline parts and fittings, maintaining cathodic protection, and other minor repairs.

The proposed Escrow contribution is part of Northglenn's commitment in this longstanding partnership. Staff is requesting \$150,000 again this year.

In 2021, approximately $\$ 600,000$ was spent to do a complete survey of the condition of the pipeline, and in 2022, about $\$ 120,000$ will be used to finish the survey.

As of early January 2022, there is roughly $\$ 120,000$ in the account, but that does not include the projected $\$ 300,000$ combined deposit from the two cities.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Attached to this memorandum is CR-5, a resolution that, if approved, would authorize the transfer of $\$ 150,000$ from the Water Fund to the Standley Lake Pipeline Joint Operating Escrow Account.

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The escrow account is held at Wells Fargo Corporate Trust Services and is independently audited by RSM LLP. Funds drawn from the escrow account must be approved by both cities.

Staff recommends approval of CR-5.
