

## **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, Congress and the General Assembly of

the State of Colorado have designated May 15th as National Peace Officers' Memorial Day, and the week of May 14th through 20th as National

Law Enforcement Memorial Week; and

WHEREAS, during Law Enforcement Memorial Week, and in particular on Peace

Officers' Memorial Day, we honor those officers who made the ultimate

sacrifice while performing their sworn duty; and

**WHEREAS,** since the first recorded death in 1791, more than 22,000 law enforcement

officers in the United States have been killed in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, 143 law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty in the

United States. Three officers were killed in the line of duty in Colorado: Corporal Nathaniel Alan Carrigan of the Park County Sheriff's Office; Trooper Cody James Donahue of the Colorado State Patrol; and Deputy

Sheriff Derek Mace Geer of the Mesa County Sheriff's Office; and

WHEREAS, the City of Northglenn tragically lost one of their own officers, Corporal

Edgar "E.B." Rains Jr., who was killed in the line of duty 33 years ago on May 30<sup>th</sup>, 1984. In honor of Corporal Rains and other fallen officers, a candlelight vigil will be held in E.B. Rains, Jr. Memorial Park on Thursday,

May 18, 2017; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate for all citizens to join together in

commemorating police officers, past and present, who by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities have rendered a dedicated service to

their community, helping to preserve the rights and security of all citizens.

**NOW THEREFORE, I,** Joyce Downing, Mayor of the City of Northglenn, Colorado, do hereby proclaim May 14<sup>th</sup> through 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017 as **National Law Enforcement Memorial Week** in the City of Northglenn and call upon all citizens to observe this week with appropriate ceremonies and observances.

I FURTHER proclaim May 15th, 2017 as National Peace Officers' Memorial

**Day** in the City of Northglenn in honor of those law enforcement officers who, through their courageous deeds, have made the ultimate sacrifice in service to their community.
