SUBJECT: CR-28 – Per Capita Funding for the NAHF

RECOMMENDATION: Attached to this memorandum is a Resolution, which, if approved, would release the per capita funds appropriated for the Northglenn Arts and Humanities Foundation (NAHF). The release of the appropriation of \$27,060 of per capita funds to NAHF is recommended by staff to allow for the continued operations of the partnership between the NAHF and the City of Northglenn's Theatre & Cultural Services division. NAHF Board of Trustees will accept these funds, and utilize them in a manner consistent with the mission "...to maintain and nurture the cultural arts for the benefit of our community." Also attached to this memorandum is a letter from the NAHF Board of Trustees indicating a willingness to accept this decreased appropriation for 2011.

BACKGROUND: Through Resolution 04-107, the City of Northglenn has supported the intention to fund the Northglenn Arts & Humanities Foundation (NAHF) based upon a formula of \$1.00 multiplied by number of residents living within the City's boundaries. In 2009, funding was decreased to accommodate economic challenges. The revenue and expenditure projections for the City's Theatre & Cultural Services programs are directly impacted by the funding available to the NAHF. These funds, in addition to the funds allocated by the City for this division, allow for high quality programs to be available for children, adults and seniors in our community at an affordable rate.

Under normal circumstances, additional monies received from per capita funding would be allocated to sculpture maintenance, monumental sculpture purchases, administration, and help create new programming. The reduced funding that has been in place since 2009 will allow for program continuity in the short-term. In the long term, impacts to programming and SCFD funding will likely be seen as a result of this decrease in per capita funding from \$1.00 to \$0.75 per resident.

SCFD has granted the NAHF \$49,130 for 2011. Work is being done to retain sponsors who have provided financial support for cultural programs in the past, as well as to seek out new sponsors, all of which will help augment NAHF funding. The per capita and SCFD funds, however, make up the greatest portion of monies used in fulfilling the mission. SCFD funding would likely again be secured in 2012, if the \$27,060 is released to the NAHF for 2011.

In light of the current financial climate, the NAHF has again proposed a single year reduction in the City's per capita funding from \$1.00 per capita to \$0.75 per capita to assist in meeting the challenge of budget constraints in the general fund. This figure is in line with the anticipated expenses.

BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS: NAHF per capita funds are budgeted in the amount of \$27,060 in Outside Agency Funding in the 2011 adopted budget.

In light of the current financial climate, the NAHF is proposing to remain at the funding level of \$0.75 per capita, rather than the traditional \$1.00 per capita, for an additional year. A RESOLUTION APPROVING FUNDING FOR THE NORTHGLENN ARTS AND HUMANITIES FOUNDATION'S STRATEGIC PLAN

WHEREAS, the Northglenn Arts and Humanities Foundation (the "Foundation"), is a Colorado non-profit corporation organized and existing for the purpose of furthering artistic and cultural opportunities in the City of Northglenn; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation performs an important public purpose by encouraging the development of art located within the City and partially funding other cultural opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to encourage the Foundation in its mission and has historically appropriated funding for the Foundation based on a formula of \$1.00 times the number of residents living within the City's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, by the adoption of Resolution 04-107, Series of 2004, declared its intent to appropriate funds in future years for the Foundation's important public purpose but has determined it must give less than the desired and historical amount for 2011 based on the City's current budgetary constraints.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHGLENN, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves as a temporary reduction funding for the Northglenn Arts and Humanities Foundation in an amount less than \$1.00 times the number of persons residing within the City's boundaries as estimated by the Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG) for the year 2011 based on the Foundation's minimum needs and expenses. Said amount is \$27,060.00.
