**SUBJECT:** CR-116 – Nov. 7, 2023 Ballot Question – ½% Sales Tax Expiring in 2025

### **PURPOSE**

To consider CR-116, a resolution to place the ½% sales and use tax question on the Nov. 7, 2023 ballot

### **BACKGROUND**

On June 5, staff provided information to City Council on a potential ballot question regarding the existing  $\frac{1}{2}$ % sales and use tax that is set to expire on Dec. 31, 2025, as requested at the City Council strategic planning retreat. There was Council consensus to bring the question back at the Aug. 28 meeting in the form of a resolution submitting the question to voters.

In 2001, voters approved a ½% sales and use tax to be used for the purpose of meeting the water supply needs of the community with an expiration in 2009. The tax was extended by voters in 2008 for another 6-year period, and again extended in 2013 through 2025.

The  $\frac{1}{2}$ % sales and use tax generates approximately \$3.5 million annually and has a balance of \$18 million currently held in reserve. Future projects that will utilize these funds include the Aquifer Storage and Recovery project, the water line project to Section 36 in Weld County that will support the Wastewater Treatment Plant operations and potential future development of the property.

Without raising additional taxes, the extension of the ½% sales and use tax would be used to support the City's road rehabilitation programs, public safety operations, park amenity improvements, and other general operations.

### **BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS**

The City's regular municipal election will be held on Nov. 7, 2023 to elect members of the City Council. Funding for the regular election has been included in the 2023 Budget. The addition of this ballot question will not have a significant impact on the City's final cost of the election.

The City Clerk is required to certify the City's ballot content to the County Clerk and Recorders by 3:00 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 8, 2023.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of CR-116.
