WHEREAS,

October has been designated as National Substance Abuse Prevention Month to collectively focus on preventing substance abuse, remember those we have lost to the addiction crisis, congratulate those who have taken steps to recovery, and acknowledge the family members, friends, and professionals supporting them; and

WHEREAS.

substance use disorders affect people from all walks of life and all age groups. Millions of Americans suffer from substance abuse, which includes underage drinking, alcohol dependency, non-medical use of prescription drugs, abuse of over-the-counter medications, and illicit drug use; and

WHEREAS.

every day, people are hurt by alcohol and drug use. From diminished achievement in schools to greater risks on our roads and in our communities, to the heartache of lives cut tragically short from overdoses, the consequences of substance use are profound; and

WHEREAS.

addiction is a treatable medical disorder and recovery from addiction is in reach for anyone. In a society that often stigmatizes addiction, it is imperative that we promote empathy and understanding so that more people get the help they need; and

we are grateful for the efforts of organizations who provide substance abuse prevention programs to reach young people, law enforcement agencies and school districts who are prepared to respond to overdoses, and community members who work to lessen the stigma surrounding substance abuse and support individuals who are struggling with, or in recovery from, substance use disorders.
