Council member Carrico stated the Adams 12 School District has
partnered with Special Olympics to develop a Unified Sports Program
and extended an invitation to Council to attend the 2015 Featured
Special Olympics Project UNIFY/Adams 12 Five Star Schools
basketball game on Tuesday, April 7th at Horizon High School.
Council member Carrico thanked everyone who came out to the Dine
and Donate event at The Glenn Bar and Grille which benefited the
Northglenn Community Foundation's Utility Bill Assistance
Program.

Mayor Pro Tem C. Dodge reported she attended the Webster Lake
Relay For Life kick-off meeting at the Northglenn STEM School and

provided information about the monthly meetings that will be held for anyone interested in participating in the Relay event. Mayor Pro Tem Dodge reported she attended the Citizens' Police Academy Alumni Association of Northglenn (CPAAAN) volunteer appreciation dinner and reminded everyone that a 9 News Health Fair will be held at Crossroads Baptist Church at 104th Avenue and Huron Street on April 20th from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

Mayor Downing reported a Senior Conference will be held on April 23rd at the Adams County Fairgrounds and noted this year's theme is Health and Safety for Seniors: Taking Care of Ourselves and Our Community.

Council member W. Dodge reported on the Farmers Highline Canal Cleanup project, at which volunteers collected over 500 bags of trash, and announced there are 104 days until the Rotary Ducky Derby.

Council member Mullica reported he attended the National League of Cities (NLC) conference in Washington D.C. and stated it was a great conference. Council member Mullica reported he attended the Ralston House dinner, and stated he is proud of Northglenn's involvement with the Ralston House organization.

Council member Snetzinger announced that she and Council member Wieneke will host a Ward 4 meeting on April 14, 2015. Council member Snetzinger reported on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and provided information on sponsorship guidelines and vendor permits the Board approved. Council member Snetzinger announced there are two vacancies on the Parks Board and encouraged residents to apply to serve on the City's boards and commissions.
