١.	SCHEDULE OF ACTIVITIES: The following schedule of activities delineates the timing of the solicitation and the estimated project schedule. These dates may be subject to change.

- 5. INTERPRETATION OF DOCUMENTS AND SPECIFICATIONS: Wherever the word "contract" appears, it shall be held to include all the documents as listed. No less than all of the parts of the contract documents shall constitute the formal contract. If any person contemplating submitting a proposal for the proposed contract is in doubt as to the true meaning of any part of specifications, schedules, or information sheets or the proposed contract documents, he may submit to the project manager a written request for an interpretation thereof. The person submitting the request will be responsible for its prompt and actual delivery. Any interpretation of such documents will be made only by an addendum duly issued, and a copy of such addendum will be mailed or delivered to each person receiving a set of such documents. The Northglenn Urban Renewal Authority (NURA) will not be responsible for any explanation or interpretation of such documents which anyone presumes to make on behalf of the NURA.
- **6. TERMS AND CONDITIONS:** As set forth in the contract agreements and any supplemental, the following terms and conditions will apply to this Request for Proposal, each vendor's proposal and to the negotiations, if any, of any said contract. Submission of a proposal in response to this RFP indicates the vendor's acceptance of the terms and conditions contained in this document and the contract.
- 7. **BIDDER EXPENSES:** The NURA will not be responsible for any expenses incurred by any vendor in preparing and submitting an offer.
- **8. WITHDRAWAL:** A vendor may withdraw his proposal at any time prior to the expiration of the final date and time set for receipt of bids. Withdrawal notification must be in written form, and must be received in the Offices of the City Clerk prior to the closing date and time.
- 9. IRREVOCABILITY: Following the time of closing, all bids will become irrevocable offers to the NURA and will remain as such until 90 days from date of submission. By submission of a bid, the vendor agrees to enter

- into a contract. In addition all quoted prices will be firm and valid up to 90 days from date of submission The NURA may, in its sole discretion, release any proposal and return any bonds if applicable prior to the 90 days.
- **10. LATE PROPOSALS:** Any proposal received after the Final date and time for receipt of proposal will not be accepted and will be unopened and discarded without being considered.
- 11. SIGNATURES OF VENDORS: Each vendor shall sign his proposal, using his legal signature and giving his full business address. The person signing the proposal must be an officer of the company or partnership. Bids by partnerships shall be signed with the partnership name by one of the members of the partnership or by an authorized representative, followed by the signature and designation of the President, Secretary, or other persons authorized to bind it in the matter. The names of all persons signing should also be printed below the signature. A proposal by a person who affixes to his signature the word, "President", "Secretary", "Agent" or other designation without disclosing his principal, may be held to be a proposal of the individual signing. When requested by the NURA, satisfactory evidence of the authority of the officer signing in behalf of the corporation shall be furnished. Bids submitted electronically are to be typed in lieu of written signature (see the cover letter).
- **12. OPEN RECORDS ACT:** Notwithstanding any language contained in a proposal to the contrary, all proposals submitted to the NURA become the property of the NURA. Any information considered proprietary should be marked by the vendor and as such and will be kept confidential to the extent provided by law.
- **13. SALES TAX:** Vendors shall not include federal, state, or local excise, sales or use taxes in prices offered, as the NURA is exempt from payment of such taxes.
- 14. MISTAKES IN BIDDING INSTRUCTIONS: If the NURA makes a mistake in drafting the bidding instructions or any other contract documents, the NURA reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to require that vendors submit an alternate proposal with adjustments made to correct the error(s). Such errors will be set forth in an addendum. If the vendor has already been selected and has started performing work under the contract, and the NURA then discovers a mistake in the contract documents for which the NURA is responsible, the NURA may opt to reform the contract. If the mistake causes the vendor to receive compensation for materials not used in the work or for labor that would not be required for the work, the contract price shall be decreased proportionally. If the mistake causes the vendor to fail to bid on work which must be performed in order to properly complete the contract, the NURA may increase the contract price to equal the proportionate increase in the cost of required materials and labor caused to the vendor. In the alternative, the NURA may solicit bids for such additional work, or the NURA may reassign such additional work to another vendor, as the NURA deems appropriate. Nothing in this provision shall apply to mistakes made by the vendor in completing the proposal form or in performing the contract.
- **15. ACCEPTANCE OF PROPOSAL:** It is expressly understood and agreed that the NURA reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive formalities, and accept the proposal which appears to be in the NURA's best interest.
- **16. APPEAL OF AWARD:** Solicitations will be awarded based on multiple criteria, price being just one of the conditions. Vendors can review the solicitation's special terms and conditions for information on evaluation criteria. Vendors may appeal the award decision by submitting, in writing, to the NURA, a request for reconsideration within 7 calendar days after the posting of the Notice of Intent to Award, provided that the appeal is sought by the vendor prior to the NURA finalizing a contract with the selected vendor. Vendors who were deemed non- responsive are ineligible to participate in the appeal process.
- 17. DEFENSE OF SUITS: In case any action at law or suit in equity is brought against the NURA, any officer, employee, or agent thereof, for or on account of the failure, omission, or neglect of the vendor to do and perform any of the covenants, acts, matters, or things by this contract undertaken to be done or performed, or for the injury or damage caused by the negligence of the vendor or his subcontractors or his or their agents, or in connection with any claim or claims based on the lawful demands of subcontractors, workmen, material, men or suppliers or machinery and parts thereof, equipment, power tools and supplies incurred in the fulfillment of the contract, the vendor shall indemnify and save harmless the NURA, officers, employees, and agents of the NURA, of and from all losses, damages, costs (including attorney's fees), expenses, judgments, or decrees whatever arising out of such action of suit that may be brought as aforesaid.

- 18. CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS: If the NURA decides to proceed and to negotiate a contract, the NURA intends to provide written notification to the vendor whose proposal is deemed by the NURA to be in the best interests of the NURA and the NURA will attempt to negotiate a contract with the selected vendor(s) on terms and conditions stated in this RFP or in the successful vendor's bid, but shall also include terms and conditions later negotiated. If the NURA and the successful vendor are unable to execute a contract and the vendor has been notified that it is the successful vendor then the NURA may cease all discussions with the (first) successful vendor without any further obligation to that vendor and select another (second) vendor as the successful vendor. If the (second) vendor is rejected, as per the terms above, then the NURA, without any further obligation to that vendor, may select another (third) vendor as the successful vendor and so on, or the NURA reserves the right to reject all proposals and re-bid.
- **19. OPENING OF PROPOSALS:** The NURA reserves the right to open Proposals received in response to this RFP, privately and unannounced, after the closing date and time.
- **20. EXTENSION OF TIME:** No time extensions are being considered at this time; however, should the NURA extend this proposal, all vendors will be given the same considerations.

### I. INTRODUCTION & PURPOSE

The Northglenn Urban Renewal Authority (NURA) is soliciting proposals for engineering/design, permitting, bidding assistance, and construction administration services for the above-referenced project. The intent of the Project is to improve the appearance of the said area(s) to a pleasing appearance that compliments the existing landscaping located within the adjacent median ramp areas at 104<sup>th</sup> Avenue and I-25, within the assigned construction budget.

### II. PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

The Project is located at the interchange at 104<sup>th</sup> Avenue between the on/off median ramps located on the east and west sides of I-25. The scope of this Professional Service Agreement is for the design of low maintenance irrigation and landscape improvements. The areas to be improved are those located within the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) right-of-way between the on/off ramps and the highway (Attachment A - Aerial Project Area Map).

There are currently four total parcels, of which are broken down into three potential phased landscaping areas (Attachment A):

- Parcel 1 1.7 Acres
- Parcel 2 1.3 Acres
- Parcel 3 1.1 Acres
- Parcel 4 1.0 Acres

The improvements are within the CDOT right-of-ways, and will require both the City and their final approvals. NURA will be funding the design and construction of these improvements. The proposal should consist of providing new low maintenance landscape features, which could include a combination of trees, plants, shrubs and irrigated areas. Recommended improvements would be similar to the on/off ramps completed in Thornton, CO at Thornton Parkway. As indicated on **Attachment A**, the four total parcels have been broken down into three separate phased areas. The intent of this proposal is to generate a landscape design that will include alternates allowing the owner to phase the project if necessary. The timing of the full construction of the project will depend on the costs of the base design and alternates.

### III. PROJECT BUDGET

This project has a total project budget of \$500,000 budget. The selected team will work with the NURA to meet the design goals, while proving a phased approach with alternates to meet the budget. Future construction phases will be evaluated in the next budget cycle.

### IV. PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

The Consultant shall provide three (3) copies and a single PDF version on a CD or Flash Drive of the proposal.

- A. Bid Summary Completed and included with the full proposal (Attachment E)
- B. Introduction/Executive Summary Introduce your firm and the project team, including sub-consultants/contractors. Provide an overview of your firm's experience specific to the scope of work. Provide resumes for the Principal in Charge, the Project Manager, and all other personnel assigned to the project. Include a matrix of personnel directly involved in the various stages of review by phase and percentage of time.
- C. **Proposal** Provide a detailed approach on how your firm will accomplish the *Scope of Work* requested. Identify your firm's protocol for managing budget and keeping the City informed of potential "scope creep".
- D. **Project Experience** Provide no more than five (5) specific projects demonstrating relevant experience on projects similar in scope (design and construction administration), the total construction value, project images, the name of the construction contractor, the project completion date, the construction value, the construction duration, the project owner's point of contact (include name, title, telephone numbers and e-mail addresses) and contact information for other project team members (such as the contractor). Highlight the Respondent's proposed team's experience on these projects. Align proposed team's experience with the Respondent's most relevant projects being presented.
- E. **References** Include at least three (3) references for similar projects completed within the past three (3) years. The reference information should include the owner, owner's representative and general contractor each with its contact information, including phone number and e-mail address, and a brief description of the project.
- F. **Fee Proposal Schedule** Include as an Exhibit to the proposal a 2015 fee schedule that will be applicable to all charges (time, materials, overhead, and mark-up).
- G. **Timelines & Deliverables** Proposals shall include estimated timelines for deliverables, meetings, and review times, as anticipated with a Contract Award date of **March 11, 2015**.
- H. Submittal Package The overall proposal submitted is not intended to be an expansive elaborate document. It should be well composed for simplicity and ease of understanding. Maximum length, not including resumes or appendices, not to exceed twenty (20) pages.

### V. SCOPE OF WORK

NURA requires that the following Design and Construction Services be performed by the Consultant as it relates to the above described Project and constitutes the basis for this Agreement.

### Section 1 – Concept Plan

- A. The Consultant shall attend a Project Design Kickoff Meeting with NURA, CDOT, Northglenn city staff, and NURA's Owner's Representative that will oversee the project (Team).
- B. Following the Project Kickoff Meeting, the Consultant shall conduct a Data Gathering Meeting with the Team and meet at the Project site to review the existing field conditions in order to obtain information and understand the desired outcome of the Project.
- C. Consultant to provide an ALTA survey including;
  - 1. Boundaries
  - 2. Easements
  - 3. Monuments
  - 4. Vicinity map
  - 5. Flood zone designation
  - 6. Gross land area
  - 7. Contours and the datum elevations
  - 8. Utility locations
- D. After conducting the field review with the Team and following the Project Kickoff Meeting, the Consultant shall develop a minimum of three phased conceptual landscape plans with drawings and sketches for discussions and input from Team. The Consultant shall develop colored renderings to support each concept. Renderings shall be at least 24" x 36" in size or larger as deemed necessary for presentation to others. Proposed landscape improvements shall not obstruct visibility or create maintenance issues and shall be resistant to winter conditions and snow removal activities.
- E. The consultant will be responsible for coordination with CDOT on the preliminary approvals of the proposed concept plan(s).
- F. Based on input from the Team from thorough site investigations and analyses performed independently by the Consultant, the Consultant shall prepare and submit a Pre-Design Report and drawings including the following, at a minimum:
  - 1. Landscape concepts to reflect the existing median landscape improvements along with the proposed roadside landscape improvements. The concepts shall be reflected on drawings and renderings for review by Northglenn. The scope and design concepts shall be based on the input from the Team and CDOT. The Consultant shall prepare a graphic representation of each concept. The graphic representation shall consist of at least three (3) graphics twenty-four inch (24") x thirty-six inch (36") thirty-six inch in size.
  - 2. A list of plant material and pictures of the proposed landscape treatments for approval by Northglenn. The list shall depict original tree / shrub size at inception and at maturity.

- 3. Engineers to submit an opinion of Probable Construction Cost for the proposed concepts. Northglenn requires that a construction contingency allowance of at least ten percent (10%) of the Project construction budget be reserved and carried as a separate line item in all construction cost estimates.
- G. It is Northglenn's intent to have the Consultant conduct one (1) presentation to the City Council and NURA prior to submittal of the draft Pre-design Report. The Consultant shall prepare graphic presentation materials and give a presentation to NURA and City Council as appropriate. The Consultant shall document the proceedings of this meeting in the Pre-Design Report and assist Northglenn in addressing and resolving City Staff and CDOT (if any) concerns as required to amend the concept(s) as necessary until final approval of a conceptual design is achieved.
- H. The Consultant shall submit three (3) copies and (1) electronic copy of the Pre-Design Report and drawings.
- I. Northglenn requires a minimum of fourteen (14) Calendar Days to review the documents. The Consultant shall attend a Pre-design Review Meeting with Northglenn, record comments of interested parties, and distribute minutes to all attendees. The Consultant shall revise the draft Pre-design Report and mapping to reflect the comments and design decisions and submit three (3) copies and one (1) electronic copy of the final Pre-design Report documents, to include a Utility ID report and opinion of probable costs for entire project.
- J. It is Northglenn's intent to identify the preferred concept at the Pre-design Review Meeting which shall be the basis for the final design phases prior to Consultant proceeding on the subsequent phases.

### Section 2 - Civil Construction Plans (60%)

- A. The Consultant shall prepare all appropriate drawings and specifications to sixty percent (60%) complete based upon the selected concept and Northglenn Standards. Consultant shall also provide electronic, Auto CAD or a format compatible with Northglenn's system of 60% complete drawings.
- B. Drawings shall be twenty-four (24) inches x thirty-six (36) inches in size, with a plan scale of one (1) inch = twenty (20) feet; for building plans use a scale of a quarter (1/4) inch = one (1) foot for small projects or partial plans and an eighth (1/8) inch = one (1) foot for larger projects, or as otherwise appropriate and acceptable to Northglenn. All drawing graphics shall fit on eleven inch (11") x seventeen inch (17") paper when reduced to half size. All graphics, including text and dimensions, shall be legible when reduced to half size. Drawing graphics shall not be obscured when bound.
- C. Prior to submittal of the design, the Consultant shall perform a thorough coordination review of all drawings and specifications, including sub-consultant drawings and specifications, and correct any discrepancies. The drawings shall show, at a minimum, all existing and proposed features both above and below the ground including but not limited to streets, sidewalks, fences, gates, utilities, signs, fixtures, pavements, plantings, trails, water, sewer, gas and electrical services, and other existing utilities such as storm sewer, telephone and cable.

The Consultant shall provide drawing sheets which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 1. A Title sheet or sheets with Northglenn's approval signature block, a location map, the Project name and number, issue block with dates and revision number, summary of applicable codes and standards, Drawing Index, sheet number block, space for professional stamp, name, street address, phone, fax, and e-mail address of Consultant and all sub-consultants.
- 2. Index sheet and key map
- 3. Standard plans and standard details
- 4. Project layout & control
- 5. Typical sections
- 6. Drainage and Utility Plan
- 7. CDOT coordination and permitting
- 8. Tabulation of quantities sheet
- 9. Landscape plans including location of and schedule of plant materials with right-of-way limits and utility locations.
- 10. Irrigation plan, along with proposed details and service connections. The plan shall include main lines and a sprinkler head layout; and shall include scheduling information confirming the ability of the system to operate in accordance with Northglenn's 2014 ROW Standards and Specifications.
- 11. Staging area plan, site access restriction plan.
- 12. Proposed traffic control plan during construction.
- 13. Tabulation of construction signs and traffic control devices
- 14. Erosion Control plans
- D. The Consultant shall prepare preliminary Technical Specifications to describe the elements of Work proposed. In general, the Technical Specifications will be as detailed as possible for all Work to be performed accurately and completely.
- E. All Technical Specifications shall be coordinated with Northglenn's General and Special Conditions and shall not repeat or conflict with any information contained in the General and Special Conditions or other standard Northglenn front end Contract documents.
- F. The Technical Specifications shall not make any generalized blanket references to City of Northglenn Standards and Specifications, to CDOT Specifications, or to other national standards. If any sections of these standards and specifications are to be included by reference, the Project Technical Specifications shall cite specific chapters and/or paragraphs of the reference standards.
- G. The City's 2014 ROW Standards and Specifications are intended to be the minimum standards acceptable on private development Projects and do not necessarily represent the technical requirements Northglenn wishes to achieve on a particular Northglenn Capital Improvement Project. Obtain approval in writing from Northglenn prior to citing these reference standards and specifications. Performance specifications shall only be used with the prior written approval of Northglenn.
- H. The Technical Specifications document must be prepared without section breaks and the numbering shall be at the bottom center of the page. The Consultant shall prepare a Project Manual Index which includes all Northglenn front end documents sections plus the Technical Specification sections. K. This project will utilize a unit price contract format for construction. The Consultant shall include a method for measurement and payment for Work performed under each section of the Technical Specifications.

- I. The Consultant shall comply with the International Building Code (IBC), Urban Drainage and Flood Control District (UDFCD), CDPHE MS4, CDOT, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and all other nationally adopted design standards, as well as other standards adopted by Northglenn, in designing the Project.
- J. The Consultant shall prepare an updated Engineer's Estimate of Probable Construction Cost for the Project. The estimate shall be based on a Work breakdown structure describing finite elements of the Work and unit prices applicable to each element. The Work breakdown structure shall include items for mobilization and Project close-out.
- K. Northglenn requires that a construction contingency allowance of at least ten percent (10%) of the Project construction budget be reserved and carried as a separate line item in all cost estimates. For Projects that are to use the unit price method of measurement and payment, the Consultant shall prepare measurement and payment specifications for each item proposed. Should the updated cost estimate exceed the currently approved budget, Consultant shall prepare a list of possible VE alternates to bring the design back within budget. Northglenn will either approve the inclusion of VE suggestions and/or amend the budget prior to commencing with the next phase of design.
- L. The Consultant shall prepare and submit information to be incorporated with Northglenn's standard Construction Contract Documents including, at a minimum, the following:
  - 1. A brief description (one paragraph) of the Project that adequately depicts the Work to be completed, which will be used in the Solicitation for Bids of Northglenn's standard Contract Documents.
  - 2. An estimate of the number of consecutive Calendar Days that will be required for completion of construction of the Project, which will be included in the Contract of Northglenn's standard Construction Contract Documents. The estimate shall take into account average weather conditions for the time of the year which construction is anticipated to take place. The estimate shall consider any intermediate milestones and construction phasing that may be necessary to complete the work.
  - 3. A summary of recommended modifications to the Special Conditions section of Northglenn's standard Construction Contract Documents. The Special Conditions are used to modify the standard General Conditions to fit the specifics of each project. The General Conditions will not be edited. The summary shall include, at a minimum, the type of schedule to be provided by the Contractor (whether critical path method (CPM) or Gant), a list of other outside contractors and/or agencies the Contractor will be required to coordinate with, any special insurance requirements, language for unique conditions such as assignment of pre-purchased materials or equipment to the general contractor, a calculation for recommended liquidated damages to be imposed if the general contractor should fail to complete the Project within the specified contract time, bid item descriptions including measurement and payment information, and an estimate of the time required for the review of submittals.
  - 4. A "Schedule of Contract Items and Prices" using Northglenn's standard format. This schedule shall contain blank areas where the bidder will fill in the amount of his Bid for each recommended item. A mobilization item is mandatory for all Bid Schedules.

- M. The Consultant shall complete the Preliminary Design Phase of work and submit three (3) sets and one (1) electronic copy of preliminary drawings half size (11 by 17), specifications, and Engineer's Estimate of Probable Construction Cost. Consultant shall also provide Auto CAD file of 60% complete drawings.
- N. Northglenn will require a minimum of fourteen (14) Calendar Days to review the submitted information. The Consultant shall attend a Field Inspection Review (FIR) Meeting and record comments of all interested parties. The Consultant shall be responsible for documenting all decisions reached during the meeting and preparing and submitting the meeting minutes to all attendees.

### Section 3 - Final Civil Package (95%)

- A. Based on comments received at the FIR Meeting, the Consultant shall prepare pre-final and final drawings and specifications in Northglenn's required format.
- B. The Consultant shall identify and utilize an individual to perform an independent quality control check of the drawings and specifications to assure the documents are clear and complete and to assure functional coordination of the varied systems and components of the construction documents.
- C. Consultant shall prepare an updated Engineer's Estimate of Probable Construction Cost just prior to submitting the pre-final documents (approximately ninety-five percent (95%) complete design). The estimate shall be based on a Work breakdown structure describing finite elements of the work and unit prices applicable to each element. The Work breakdown structure shall include items for mobilization and project close-out. Northglenn requires that a construction contingency allowance of at least ten percent (10%) of the Project construction budget be reserved and carried as a separate line item in all cost estimates. Should the pre-final Engineer's Estimate of Probable Costs exceed NURA's currently approved budget, the Consultant shall be required to revise the design to come within NURA's budget at no additional cost to NURA. NURA may contract with an independent third party to provide assistance in cost estimating and VE. The Consultant shall cooperate with and participate in the VE process. The Consultant shall make changes to the design documents resulting from this effort.
- D. The Consultant shall complete the pre-final design documents (approximately ninety-five percent (95%) design completion) and submit three (3) sets and one (1) electronic copy of pre-final drawings, specifications, and revised pre-final Engineer's Estimate of Probable Construction Cost. Consultant shall also provide electronic, Auto CAD, or a format compatible with Northglenn's system of 95% complete drawings.
- E. Northglenn will require a minimum of fourteen (14) Calendar Days to review the documents. The Consultant shall attend a Final Office Review (FOR) Meeting to receive comments on the pre-final documents from all interested Parties. The Consultant shall be responsible for documenting all comments and decisions reached during the meeting and preparing and submitting the minutes of the meeting.

- F. The Consultant shall plan and provide any required traffic control for the design process for field activities, which may interfere with traffic operations within existing roadways or parking areas. Traffic control operations will be in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as well as the American Traffic Safety Services Association's ATSSA Guide for Work Area Traffic Control. NURA shall submit their traffic control plan to Northglenn and obtain the necessary permit(s).
- G. The Consultant shall coordinate all document review efforts with CDOT and will incorporate all comments and CDOT requirements into the final documents.
- H. The Consultant's pre-final and final Contract Documents shall provide drawing sheets which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
  - a. Title sheet or sheets with Northglenn's appointed representative(s) with approval signature block, a location map, the Project name and number, issue block with dates and revision number, summary of applicable codes and standards, Drawing Index, sheet number block, space for professional stamp, name, street address, phone, fax and email address of Consultant, and all sub-consultants.
  - b. Tabulation of "Estimated Quantities" and Bid Tabulation sheets (Table format).
  - c. As a minimum the following information shall be included in the drawings:
    - i. Index sheet and key map
    - ii. Standard plans and standard details
    - iii. Project layout & control
    - iv. Topography, ROW, easements and adjacent property ownership
    - v. Typical sections
    - vi. Tabulation of quantities sheet
    - vii. Existing utilities
    - viii. Drainage plans as applicable
    - ix. Landscape construction plans including schedule of plant materials.
    - x. Irrigation plans, along with proposed details and service connections. The plan shall include main lines and a sprinkler head layout; and shall include scheduling information confirming the ability of the system to operate in accordance with Northglenn's 2014 ROW Standards and Specifications
    - xi. Staging area plan, site access restriction plan
    - xii. Proposed traffic control plan during construction
    - xiii. Tabulation of signs and traffic control devices
    - xiv. Erosion control plans
  - d. Dimensioned construction drawings for all required disciplines which may include, but not necessarily be limited to, ROW plans, demolition plans, staging plans, traffic control, erosion control, drainage, roads, trails, utilities, grading, paving, landscape, irrigation, profiles, sections, elevations, schedules, and details as required to detail the work sufficiently to allow for the complete construction of the Project.
- I. The Consultant shall comply with the ADA, and all other nationally adopted design standards, as well as other standards adopted by Northglenn, in designing each element of the Project.

- I. The Consultant shall make document revisions noted and agreed upon at the FOR meeting. Revisions may include denoting work elements as bid alternatives and revising the bidding form and alternates specification section if, in NURA's sole opinion, the cost estimates are not consistent with the budgeted level of funding and the VE efforts have not sufficiently reduced the cost estimate to align with the budget. If, in NURA's sole opinion, the final documents submitted by the Consultant do not adequately respond to the FOR comments, the Consultant shall revise and reissue the final documents at no additional cost to NURA until all comments are resolved to NURA's satisfaction.
- K. When NURA determines that the final Contract Documents are acceptable, the Consultant shall submit the following to NURA:
  - 1. Two (2) sets bound "Project Manuals" and two (2) sets of half size drawings. The Project Manual shall be 8.5" x 11" and shall include NURA's front end documents provided for the Project.
  - 2. One (1) set of unbound copy-ready specifications (not stamped). Issue block shall say "Issued for Bidding" and date.
    - a. The specifications shall be single sided 8.5" x 11" and in a format compatible for inclusion into the NURA's and the City's standard construction contract documents.
    - b. Reproducible drawings shall be photographic polyester film duplicate reverse reading matte front side, wash-off polyester film (4 mil) reverse reading matte front side, or electrostatic copies on polyester film (reverse reading and coated with clear spray).
  - 3. Electronic files on CD of Technical Specifications and recommended revisions to the City's standard front end documents in Word format, Arial font, size 11 or 12, sided printing, 1.5" left margin and 1" right margin. Electronic files on CD of drawings in AutoCAD, or format compatible with Northglenn's system.
  - 4. A final Engineer's Estimate of Probable Construction Cost. NURA requires that ten percent (10%) of the engineer's estimate be available in the overall budget for a construction contingency, for unforeseen changes during the construction of the Project.
- L. After Initial Acceptance the Consultant will be required to provide the following information in a PDF or a non-rewritable compact disc (CD-ROM).
  - 1. Pre-design Report and review comments.
  - 2. FIR review comments.
  - 3. FOR review comments

### **Section 4 - Construction Administration**

- A. The Consultant shall attend the "Pre-bid Conference" and shall provide assistance to NURA in responding to inquiries by the prospective bidders during the bidding period. Bidding for the first construction phase is anticipated to occur in Q/2 or no later than early Q3 2015.
- B. The Consultant shall prepare all necessary corrections and additional information based on prospective bidder inquiries, and shall prepare addenda in response to such inquires. NURA will issue all addenda.

- C. Should the lowest responsive and responsible Bid come in above the currently approved budget, the Consultant shall prepare VE suggestions and estimates of related cost savings to bring the Project back within budget. NURA will review the VE suggestions and estimated savings and will determine if the Project should be re-bid or awarded. Should NURA choose to re-bid the Project, the Consultant shall revise the design to bring the Project within budget, will prepare revised contract documents, and will assist in the re-bidding phase, all at no additional cost to NURA. Should NURA choose to award the Project, the Consultant shall cooperate with the selected general contractor and assist in preparation of "Proposal Requests" as directed by NURA to reduce the Project cost to within budget, all at no additional cost to NURA.
- D. At the end of the bid phase, the Consultant shall make final corrections to the contract documents based on addenda issued during the bid phase. Drawing revisions shall be indicated by encircling changes with "clouds" and including a delta indicating the addendum number. All addenda dates and delta numbers shall also be indicated in the revision block on each sheet. Project Manual revisions shall be denoted by striking through deleted text and italicizing added text with the addendum number noted in parentheses immediately following each text revision. The Project Manual index shall indicate those sections that contain revisions by placing an asterisk next to the section number in the index. The Consultant shall provide revised reproducible and electronic documents to NURA within ten (10) Calendar Days following the opening of the bids. Issue block shall say "For Construction" and shall be dated as of the general contractor's date of Notice of Award. Northglenn will issue the For Construction documents to the successful general contractor for use during the construction phases. Consultant shall be responsible for the cost of printing and distributing Construction documents to their Sub-consultants.
- E. The Consultant shall attend the "Pre-Construction Meeting" and provide assistance to NURA in responding to inquiries by the Contractor during the Pre-Construction Meeting.
- F. The Consultant shall assist the contractor as may be necessary to prepare and submit the application for a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the project.
- G. The Consultant shall promptly respond to inquiries which may arise during the course of construction.
- H. Submittal review time shall not exceed ten (10) Working Days for any submittal required for the project.
- I. The Consultant shall respond within five (5) days to requests for information (RFI) issued by NURA, the Contractor, subcontractors, testing agencies, commissioning agent, or other entities so as not to delay construction.
- J. The Consultant shall issue "Supplemental Instructions" to NURA or their designated representative when an ambiguous condition requiring clarification is discovered in the Contract Documents. The Consultant shall prepare documents providing clarification and/or correcting errors or omissions in the Contract Documents at no charge to NURA. Consultant shall prepare a Proposal Request to issue to the Contractor when such items may have a cost or schedule impact.

- K. The Consultant shall provide change order consultation as it relates to change order requests submitted by the Contractor, including but not limited to review of change order requests for impacts on schedule, quality, constructability, aesthetics, functionality, and proposed change order pricing. Change order consultation may also be necessary for discretionary changes requested by NURA and/or the City; however, such consultation is not included in the not-to-exceed fee for this Agreement. Compensation for discretionary change order consultation shall be made on a time and expense basis at the rates specified in the Schedule of Charges included in the Professional Service Agreement.
- L. After Initial Acceptance, The Consultant shall be required to provide As-Built documents based on redlined drawings provided by the Contractor and approved by NURA. Final As-Built Drawings shall be submitted by Consultant as PDF files and/or electronic files. The issue block on the drawings shall say "As-Built" and indicate the date which shall be the date of Initial Acceptance. The As-Built files shall be no larger than 24" x 36". As-built electronic drawing files shall be in a vector format compatible with the version currently in use by Northglenn (\*.dwg and .pdf format). The As-Built Project Manual shall indicate "As-Built" and the date on the cover page. The Project Manual shall be submitted both in hard copy and as an electronic file or files in Microsoft Word version currently in use by Northglenn. As-Built documents shall be submitted to NURA within fifteen (15) Calendar Days following the date of Initial Acceptance.
- M. Attend weekly site and construction meetings. Generate a field report and review the General Contractor Meeting minutes for accuracy.
- N. Prepare punch list and letter of substantial completion. Consultants to track items to completion.
- O. Assist owner with Warranty Items and attend warranty walk at 11 months.



#### AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

#### **RECITALS**:

- A. NURA requires professional services; and
- B. Consultant has held itself out to NURA as having the requisite expertise and experience to perform the required work for the project.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed for the consideration hereinafter set forth, that Consultant shall provide to NURA, professional consulting services for the project.

#### I. SCOPE OF SERVICES

Consultant shall furnish all labor and materials to perform the work and services required for the complete and prompt execution and performance of all duties, obligations, and responsibilities for the project which are described or reasonably implied from **Exhibit A** which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Scope of Services").

#### II. NURA'S OBLIGATIONS/CONFIDENTIALITY

NURA shall provide Consultant with reports and such other data as may be available to NURA and reasonably required by Consultant to perform hereunder. No project information shall be disclosed by Consultant to third parties without prior written consent of NURA or pursuant to a lawful court order directing such disclosure. All documents provided by NURA to Consultant shall be returned to NURA. Consultant is authorized by NURA to retain copies of such data and materials at Consultant's expense.

#### III. OWNERSHIP OF WORK PRODUCT

NURA acknowledges that the Consultant's work product is an instrument of professional service. Nevertheless, the products prepared under this Agreement shall become the property of NURA upon completion of the work.

#### IV. <u>COMPENSATION</u>

In consideration for the completion of the Scope of Services by Consultant, NURA shall
pay Consultant as set forth in Exhibit B in the Fee Schedule which is attached hereto and
incorporated herein by this reference (the "Fee Schedule") not to exceed a maximum o
dollars (\$00. Unless expressly set forth otherwise in
<b>Exhibit B</b> , this amount shall include all costs and expenses incurred by Consultant.

#### V. COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF WORK

Upon mutual execution of this Agreement, Consultant shall commence work on all its obligations as directed by the NURA Executive Director or NURA's legal counsel.

#### VI. CHANGES IN SCOPE OF SERVICES

A change in the Scope of Services shall constitute any material change or amendment of services or work which is different from or additional to the Scope of Services specified in Section I of this Agreement. No such change, including any additional compensation, shall be effective, or paid unless authorized by written amendment executed by NURA. If Consultant proceeds without such written authorization, then Consultant shall be deemed to have waived any claim for additional compensation, including a claim based on the theory of unjust enrichment, quantum merit or implied contract. Except as expressly provided herein, no agent, employee, or representative of NURA shall have the authority to enter into any changes or modifications, either directly or implied by a course of action, relating to the terms and scope of this Agreement.

#### VII. PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY

- A. Consultant hereby warrants that it is qualified to assume the responsibilities and render the services described herein and has all requisite corporate authority and professional licenses in good standing, required by law.
- B. The work performed by Consultant shall be in accordance with generally accepted professional practices and the level of competency presently maintained by other practicing professional firms in the same or similar type of work in the applicable community.
- C. Consultant shall be responsible for the professional quality, technical accuracy, timely completion, and the coordination of all designs, drawings, specifications, reports, and other services furnished by Consultant under this Agreement. Consultant shall, without additional compensation, correct or resolve any errors or deficiencies in his designs, drawings, specifications, reports, and other services, which fall below the standard of professional practice, and reimburse NURA for construction costs caused by errors and omissions which fall below the standard of professional practice.
- D. Approval by NURA of drawings, designs, specifications, reports, and incidental work or materials furnished hereunder shall not in any way relieve Consultant of responsibility for technical adequacy of the work. Neither NURA's review, approval or acceptance of, nor payment for, any of the services shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this Agreement or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this Agreement, and Consultant shall be and remain liable in accordance with applicable performance of any of the services furnished under this Agreement.
- E. The rights and remedies of NURA provided for under this Agreement are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.

#### VIII. <u>ILLEGAL ALIENS</u>

A. Certification. By entering into this Agreement, Consultant hereby certifies that, at the time of this certification, it does not knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien who will perform work under the Agreement and that Consultant will participate in either the E-Verify Program administered by the United States Department of Homeland Security and Social Security Administration or the Department Program administered by the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment in order to confirm the employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired for employment to perform work under the Agreement.

#### B. Prohibited Acts. Consultant shall not:

- 1. Knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien to perform work under this Agreement; or
- 2. Enter into a contract with a subcontractor that fails to certify to Consultant that the subcontractor shall not knowingly employ or contract with an illegal alien to perform work under this Agreement.

#### C. Verification.

- 1. Consultant has confirmed the employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired for employment to perform work under this Agreement through participation in either the E-Verify Program or the Department Program.
- 2. Consultant shall not use the E-Verify Program or the Department Program procedures to undertake pre-employment screening of job applicants while this Agreement is being performed.
- 3. If Consultant obtains actual knowledge that a subcontractor performing work under this Agreement knowingly employs or contracts with an illegal alien who is performing work under the Agreement, Consultant shall:
  - a. Notify the subcontractor and NURA within three (3) days that Consultant has actual knowledge that the subcontractor is employing or contracting with an illegal alien who is performing work under the Agreement; and
  - b. Terminate the subcontract with the subcontractor if within three (3) days of receiving the notice required pursuant to subparagraph (a) hereof, the subcontractor does not stop employing or contracting with the illegal alien who is performing work under the Agreement; except that Consultant shall not terminate the contract with the subcontractor if during such three (3) days the subcontractor provides information to establish that the subcontractor has not knowingly employed or contracted with an illegal alien who is performing work under the Agreement.

- D. Duty to Comply with Investigations. Consultant shall comply with any reasonable request by the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment made in the course of an investigation conducted pursuant to C.R.S. § 8-17.5-102(5)(a) to ensure that Consultant is complying with the terms of this Agreement.
- E. If Consultant does not currently employ any employees, Consultant shall sign the NO Employee Affidavit attached hereto.
- F. If Consultant wishes to verify the lawful presence of newly hired employees who perform work under the Agreement via the Department Program, Consultant shall sign the Department Program Affidavit attached hereto.

#### IX. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

Consultant agrees to indemnify and hold harmless NURA, its officers, employees, and insurers, from and against all liability, claims, and demands, on account of injury, loss, or damage, including without limitation claims arising from bodily injury, personal injury, sickness, disease, death, property loss or damage, if such injury, loss, or damage is caused in whole or in part by, or is claimed to be caused in whole or in part by, the negligent act, omission, error, professional error, mistake, negligence, or other fault of Consultant, any subcontractor of Consultant, or any officer, employee, representative, or agent of Consultant or of any subcontractor of Consultant, or which arise out of any workmen's compensation claim of any employee of Consultant or of any employee of any subcontractor of Consultant. Consultant agrees to investigate, handle, respond to, and to provide defense for and defend against any such liability, claims or demands at the sole expense of Consultant, or at the option of NURA, agrees to pay NURA or reimburse NURA for the defense costs incurred by NURA in connection with, any such liability, claims, or demands. Consultant also agrees to bear all other costs and expenses related thereto, including court costs and attorney fees, whether or not any such liability, claims, or demands alleged are groundless, false, or fraudulent. If it is determined by the final judgment of a court of any competent jurisdiction that such injury, loss, or damage was caused in whole or in part by the act, omission, or other fault of NURA, its officers, or its employees, NURA shall reimburse Consultant for the portion of the judgment attributable to such act, omission, or other fault of NURA, its officers, or employees.

#### X. <u>INSURANCE</u>

A. Consultant agrees to procure and maintain, at its own cost, a policy or policies of insurance sufficient to insure against all liability, claims, demands, and other obligations assumed by Consultant pursuant to Section IX, above. Such insurance shall be in addition to any other insurance requirements imposed by this Agreement or by law. Consultant shall not be relieved of any liability, claims, demands, or other obligations assumed pursuant to Section IX, above, by reason of its failure to procure or maintain insurance, or by reason of its failure to procure or maintain insurance in sufficient amounts, durations, or types.

- B. Consultant shall procure and maintain the minimum insurance coverages listed below. Such coverages shall be procured and maintained with forms and insurers acceptable to NURA. All coverages shall be continuously maintained to cover all liability, claims, demands, and other obligations assumed by Consultant pursuant to Section IX, above. In the case of any claims-made policy, the necessary retroactive dates and extended reporting periods shall be procured to maintain such continuous coverage.
  - 1. Workmen's compensation insurance to cover obligations imposed by applicable laws for any employee engaged in the performance of work under this Agreement, and Employer's Liability insurance with minimum limits of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) each accident, one million dollars (\$1,000,000) disease policy limit, and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) disease each employee. Evidence of qualified self-insured status may be substituted for the workmen's compensation requirements of this paragraph.
  - 2. Commercial general liability insurance with minimum combined single limits of six hundred thousand (\$600,000) each occurrence and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) general aggregate. The policy shall be applicable to all premises and operations. The policy shall include coverage for bodily injury, broad form property damage (including completed operations), personal injury (including coverage for contractual and employee acts), blanket contractual, products, and completed operations. The policy shall contain a severability of interests provision.
  - 3. Professional liability insurance with minimum limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) each claim and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) general aggregate.
- C. The policy required by paragraph 2. above shall be endorsed to include NURA and NURA's officers, employees, and consultants as additional insureds. Every policy required above shall be primary insurance, and any insurance carried by NURA, its officers, its employees, or its consultants shall be excess and not contributory insurance to that provided by Consultant. No additional insured endorsement to the policy required by paragraph 1. above shall contain any exclusion for bodily injury or property damage arising from completed operations. Consultant shall be solely responsible for any deductible losses under any policy required above.
- D. The certificate of insurance provided for NURA shall be completed by Consultant's insurance agent as evidence that policies providing the required coverages, conditions, and minimum limits are in full force and effect, and shall be reviewed and approved by NURA prior to commencement of the Agreement. No other form of certificate shall be used. If NURA is named as an additional insured on any policy which does not allow for the automatic addition of additional insureds, the Consultant's insurance agent shall also provide a copy of all accompanying endorsements recognizing NURA as an additional insured. The certificate shall identify this Agreement and shall provide that the coverages afforded under the policies shall not be cancelled, terminated or materially changed until at least thirty (30) days prior written notice has been given to NURA. The completed certificate of insurance shall be sent to:

- E. Failure on the part of Consultant to procure or maintain policies providing the required coverages, conditions, and minimum limits shall constitute a material breach of agreement upon which NURA may immediately terminate this Agreement, or at its discretion, NURA may procure or renew any such policy or any extended reporting period thereto and may pay any and all premiums in connection therewith, and all monies so paid by NURA shall be repaid by Consultant to NURA upon demand, or NURA may offset the cost of the premiums against any monies due to Consultant from NURA.
- F. NURA reserves the right to request and receive a certified copy of any policy and any endorsement thereto.
- G. The parties hereto understand and agree that NURA, its officers, and its employees, are relying on, and do not waive or intend to waive by any provision of this Agreement, the monetary limitations (presently three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000) per person and nine hundred ninety thousand dollars (\$990,000) per occurrence) or any other rights, immunities, and protections provided by the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, C.R.S. § 24-10-101 *et seq.*, as from time to time amended, or otherwise available to NURA, its officers, or its employees.

#### XI. NON-ASSIGNABILITY

Neither this Agreement, nor any of the rights or obligations of the parties hereto, shall be assigned by either party without the written consent of the other.

#### XII. TERMINATION

This Agreement shall terminate at such time as the work in Section I is completed and the requirements of this Agreement are satisfied, or upon NURA's providing Consultant with seven (7) days advance written notice, whichever occurs first. In the event the Agreement is terminated by NURA's issuance of said written notice of intent to terminate, NURA shall pay Consultant for all work previously authorized and completed prior to the date of termination. If, however, Consultant has substantially or materially breached the standards and terms of this Agreement, NURA shall have any remedy or right of set-off available at law and equity. If the Agreement is terminated for any reason other than cause prior to completion of the project, any use of documents by NURA thereafter shall be at NURA's sole risk, unless otherwise consented to by Consultant.

#### XIII. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The Consultant shall disclose any personal or private interest related to property or business within NURA. Upon disclosure of any such personal or private interest, NURA shall determine if the interest constitutes a conflict of interest. If NURA determines that a conflict of interest exists, NURA may treat such conflict of interest as a default and terminate this Agreement.

#### XIV. VENUE

This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Colorado, and any legal action concerning the provisions hereof shall be brought in the County of Adams, State of Colorado.

#### XV. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Consultant is an independent contractor. Notwithstanding any provision appearing in this Agreement, all personnel assigned by Consultant to perform work under the terms of this Agreement shall be, and remain at all times, employees or agents of Consultant for all purposes. Consultant shall make no representation that it is the employee of NURA for any purposes.

#### XVI. NO WAIVER

Delays in enforcement or the waiver of any one or more defaults or breaches of this Agreement by NURA shall not constitute a waiver of any of the other terms or obligation of this Agreement.

#### XVII. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is the entire Agreement between Consultant and NURA, and shall supersede all prior oral or written communications. None of the provisions of this Agreement may be amended, modified, or changed, except as specified herein.

#### XVIII. NOTICE

Any notice or communication between Consultant and NURA which may be required, or which may be given, under the terms of this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given when directly presented or sent pre-paid, first class United States Mail, addressed to the addresses first set forth above.
