SUBJECT: NGCC Master Plan Phase I Implementation August Update

PURPOSE

The purpose of this communication is to provide an update to City Council regarding the status of the Northglenn Civic Center (NGCC) Master Plan Phase I Implementation project.

BACKGROUND

The implementation of Phase I of the NGCC Master Plan, which includes the design and construction of the new Recreation Center, Senior Center and Theatre, as well as Memorial Parkway and associated infrastructure, was initiated in April 2018. Barker Rinker Seacat (BRS) was selected as the project architect, and Project One was selected to perform project management. In March 2019, a contract was awarded to FCI Constructors to serve as the Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) for the project.

The contract with FCI Constructors was issued in three parts, the initial contract for preconstruction services, the Site Final Guaranteed Maximum Price (Site FGMP), and the Final Guaranteed Maximum Price (FGMP). As approved at the City Council meeting on February 24, 2020, the total contracted amount with FCI is \$\$44,832,703.00 with a total contingency amount of \$3,931,295.00.

Site construction began in October 2019. Building vertical construction began in April 2020.

UPDATE

Steel joists have been installed in the gymnasium, and a portion of the roofing has been placed, as well. Many yards of concrete were brought onsite and poured to form the pools, pool decks, and pool maintenance rooms this month.

Work on the masonry walls and the under-slab crawl space for the theatre, senior center and community rooms continued through this month. The tot lot foundation was also completed. The work along Memorial Parkway has progressed to fine grading at areas near the sidewalks. Ingrade lighting for the Veteran's Memorial was installed, in preparation for pouring the concrete plaza. The team reviewed the grading around this area multiple times to verify correct lighting placement, drainage and integration with the memorial. The bicycle and pedestrian trail along the north side of Memorial Parkway is also beginning to take shape.

On July 22, the city received notification that funding has been awarded from Xcel Energy for electric vehicle (EV) infrastructure, which was very positive news. The next step will be to facilitate

a coordinated effort between Xcel Energy and FCI for the installation of the EV charging station infrastructure.

The facility has been designed with the ability to add photovoltaic panels to capture solar energy, though the installation of that system was not included in the base cost of the project. An introductory meeting was held with a vendor and the city's project team to review potential costs and benefits associated with several different solar arrays. The team will further explore the possibility of utilizing existing project funds to include a solar array, and fully recognizes and supports the city's commitment to renewable energy.

NEXT STEPS

The furniture workshops have started and are on track per the milestone schedule below. The BRS team has outlined the needs of the facility and is aligning these with the budget, set at \$350,000. The RFP process will proceed once the design process is complete.

Artist Mark Aeling presented a conceptual design for the lobby sculpture to the Northglenn Arts and Humanities Foundation (NAHF) members on August 6. The members of the NAHF were overwhelmingly in support of moving forward with Aeling's proposed design, and provided him with feedback regarding the color palette. FCI, BRS and the City's team will be meeting with Mark Aeling to review the structural and electrical needs of the piece, to ensure that the fabrication and installation process will progress with ease.

To keep our community excited and informed about the project, FCI has completed a short video that includes a series of interesting facts about the project. Once the video editing is complete it can be shared on social media. In addition, City staff is working with First Light Video Productions to do a virtual tour of the construction site, helping connect the spaces that can be seen on the project site with the renderings that community members saw during the design phase. This video is intended to be released this fall, as the project reaches the "topping out" milestone.

BUDGET/TIME IMPLICATIONS

At this time, there continue to be no significant impacts to the project schedule as a result of COVID-19. FCI is taking necessary precautions to monitor employees and contractors for symptoms, conducting daily safety briefings and enforcing social distancing protocols and mask wearing. FCI will notify the city when and if there are any specific, direct impacts to the project costs and/or schedule. Although many of the larger team meetings that include city staff, Project One staff and members of the design team, as well as FCI and their subcontractors, are still taking place virtually, construction inspections and site walks are done in person, as appropriate and necessary. This team is committed to taking a mindful approach to scheduling these in-person meetings, limiting group sizes, maintaining appropriate social distancing and wearing face coverings.

The permit delay notification presented in previous updates will be monitored as the project

progresses. The project is currently tracking well after this initial hurdle was cleared, but as the project progresses this schedule extension could result in additional contract extensions and adjustments from other vendors including Project One and BRS. No action is required at this time, but if needed, will be brought forward to City Council.

As an additional note, most of the contingency that was authorized for the design phase of the project with BRS has been expended. While there are not any current design changes anticipated, any additional changes to the scope of the BRS contract would require authorization by City Council.
