Council member Snetzinger thanked the Adams County Youth Award winners for their perseverance and congratulated the students on their accomplishments. Council member Snetzinger reported on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and stated the Board approved vendor licenses and reviewed the 2015 Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services Department annual report. Council member Snetzinger thanked staff for bringing forward bids under budget and announced a shred-a-thon and electronics takeback will be held on April 16, 2016. Council member Snetzinger congratulated Northglenn High School for being the first school in the state to offer the Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH) Program.

Council member Mullica commended the Adams County Youth Award winners and the teachers who nominated the students. Council member Mullica reported on the Ward 3 meeting and stated it was well attended. Council member Mullica reported he attended the Ralston House dinner and stated he is proud the Ralston House will be located in Northglenn. Council member Mullica reported on the HOV lanes on I-25 and announced the Farmers Highline Canal Cleanup Event will be held this Saturday.

Council member Sauers acknowledged the Adams County Youth Award winners and stated she will be participating in the Farmers Highline Canal Cleanup on Saturday.

Council member J. Brown reported on the Northglenn Urban Renewal Authority (NURA) and spoke about the Community Center Drive median project. Council member Brown reminded Council to sign the business anniversary cards in the Council mail room.

Mayor Downing commended the Adams County Youth Award winners. Mayor Downing reported she attended the press conference for the Northglenn High School P-TECH program and stated the program will start in August. Mayor Downing reported she attended the National League of Cities (NLC) Conference and spoke about her involvement with the Public Safety and Small Communities Steering Committees.

Mayor Pro Tem Dodge announced the third performance in the A Cappella Series will be held this Friday and will feature the group eLeMeNO-P. Mayor Pro Tem Dodge reported she will be participating in the Farmers Highline Canal Cleanup, encouraged everyone to volunteer for the event, and reported the Northglenn Senior Organization (NSO) luncheon will be held on Friday, March 25th at Red Lobster.

Council member B. Brown commended the Adams County Youth Award winners and stated she was impressed by the students this evening. Council member Brown reported the Planning Commission will be meeting tomorrow night and announced a Ward 2 meeting will be held on Wednesday, March 16th from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Maintenance & Operations facility.

Council member Whitman reported residents were pleased with the postcard notices for the recent Ward 3 meeting and thanked staff and residents for their participation in the meeting. Council member Whitman reported NASA Astronaut Kjell Lindgren will be at the Anythink Library York Street branch on Wednesday, March 23rd at 5:30 p.m. as part of the Space Month activities.

Council member Esquibel echoed the sentiments about the Adams County Youth Award winners and stated Northglenn High School has improved greatly under the guidance of Principal Sharee Blunt and her staff.
