We have a very affordable housing compared to much of metro Denver, so we run the risk of becoming a magnet for an unbalanced amount of low-income population, which can create a snowball effect of negative outcomes... But conversely, we have a older population, which is starting to change and become younger- So we have many young people that want to have families, and renovate those houses that are affordable, and renew and reinvigorate our city.
In reviewing the City's 2020 Budget, what are you most excited about and why?
The largest item has me the most excited. The building of the new Recreation Center will be a very big issue, and I'm sure we'll be dealing with amendments, and changes, and dealing with community outreach regarding that project.

My nature is to try to think of issues objectively. I try not to inject my emotions into political/governmental issues. I find it odd when others get overly emotional about issues, and have difficulty thinking and communicating logically.
