WHEREAS, National Day of Prayer is recognized by Coloradoans and Americans of all cultures, religions, and backgrounds, and those who participate will join in prayer to reaffirm our course as a democratic nation with the promise of liberty and justice for all; and

WHEREAS, we unite with fellow residents to exercise the freedom we have to gather in prayer to seek guidance, provision, protection, and purpose for the benefit of every individual and for our community as a whole.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Carol Dodge, Mayor of the City of Northglenn, Colorado, do hereby proclaim Thursday, May 2nd, 2019 as a
