SUBJECT: CB-1982 - Supplemental Appropriation and CIP Carry Over

PURPOSE

To consider CB-1982, a special ordinance on first reading to amend the 2022 Operating and Capital Improvement Budget. The amendments are associated with Capital Improvement Program (CIP) carry over of 2021 appropriations and additional expenditures summarized in this memo.

BACKGROUND

Section 5-8-11 of the Municipal Code states:

"After adoption of the budget, the City Council shall enact an ordinance appropriating funds for municipal operations for the ensuing fiscal year. Appropriations shall lapse at fiscal year-end for all funds except for funds appropriated pursuant to the capital projects program created by section 8.5 of the City Charter. Appropriation for projects identified in the capital projects program shall continue, and be carried forward to succeeding years, until the project is completed."

UPDATE

The CIP adjustments being carried forward from 2021 to 2022 are detailed in Attachment 1. The attachment identifies the unspent balance, or carry over, of each CIP project as of Dec. 31, 2021. Unspent project funds are considered project savings and are recognized through increased 2021 ending fund balances. If a project remained unfinished at the end of 2021, Attachment 1 lists the requested carry over of the remaining 2021 appropriation to fiscal year 2022. In certain cases, the requested carry over amount is less than what was unspent due to revisions in project cost estimates, and/or the realignment of estimated carry over amounts included during the 2022 budget process.
