Council member Whitman thanked the Police Department for recently assisting a senior resident.

Mayor Pro Tem Dodge reported the Recreation Center will be closed for annual cleaning and maintenance August 28th to September 4th, and announced the Dog Days of Summer event will be held at Kiwanis Pool on Monday, September 4th. Mayor Pro Tem Dodge announced the new Coffee House Concert Series will kick-off on September 22nd featuring Espresso! Swing at 7:30 p.m. in the D.L. Parsons Theatre, and noted a free concert featuring the Denver Municipal Band with the Northglenn High School Choir will take place on October 6th.

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Mayor Downing announced that, as of August 24th, Northglenn is the 59th municipality to receive the Certified Local Government designation.

Council member Mullica reported on the Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG) Conference he attended and spoke about information presented at the conference.

Council member Snetzinger reported on the Outside Agency Funding (OAF) Committee and stated the Committee had approved donations to the Adams County Youth Initiative, Adams County Education Consortium Career Expo, and the PAALS for Life Animal Sanctuary.
