**SUBJECT:** CB-2025 – Supplemental Appropriation

### **PURPOSE**

To consider CB-2025, a special ordinance on first reading to amend the 2024 Operating and Capital Improvement Budget. The amendments are associated with additional revenues and expenditures summarized in this memo.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Section 8.12 of the City Charter allows for budget amendments to be made after the adoption of the budget if there are available funds to appropriate.
